B. Yatauro, President of Local 393 and Steven Altamura, Frank Caracciola, Ray Festa, Alan Foley, Keith Hofler, James Lomando, Shawn Neville, Bill Sellick, James Sellick, Michael Sellick, and Chris Voytasko of DC-9 were also in attendance.

Booklets containing detailed information for all Agenda items were distributed to each Member, Executive Staff and Counsel to the Authority.

At 2:59 p.m. the Chairman called the meeting to order and asked Ms. Mancuso to conduct the roll call. Ms. Gordon is attending from our Bayshore location per Mr. Hopkins, all other members are present.

Mr. Halpin then opened the meeting for public comment. Several members of the public were present who wished to address the board at this time.

Numerous representatives of DC-9 Painters union and expressed concern over the vendor, Alpine Painters, who was awarded a contract for tank painting at the Board Meeting in July. The board was advised this contractor has been issued significant fines in the past, and there is a concern apprenticeship language was not have been included in the contract. It was added, due to the critical safety and sensitivity of the work assigned in the contract, and the public funds being used,

they would be hopeful the Authority would support apprenticeship language in this contract.

Mr. Halpin addressed their concerns by assuring them the Authority will review the matter completely and report its findings to the board, he thanked them for bringing the matter to our attention.

Mr. Szabo asked Mr. Litka to give a brief overview of the Authority's steps taken in response to the recent ransomware attack in Suffolk County. Mr. Litka advised, while we are always vigilant and working to educate employees, cyber security is a full-time job. We are exploring the possibility for even stronger, more complex passwords. Mr. Brady added, the potential to have someone in house to handle all these on-going assessments would be a great asset. Ms. Mercado offered from her perspective that someone dedicated to cyber security would be beneficial.

Mr. Szabo then asked Mr. Hopkins to provide the Board a brief overview of the past month's activities related to the Water Authority of the North Shore, adding this is an update they can expect each month. Mr. Hopkins stated, WANS met the previous evening, on September 28, and discussed committees, bylaws, email addresses, logos, and the creation of the corporate seal. Mr. Szabo expressed there was a sense of appreciation from the WANS Board members for assistance. Mr. Halpin responded that our support will help them accelerate the process. Mr. Lefkowitz asked if their funding had been approved. Mr. Hopkins stated the funding was not yet applied for, as the funding needs to be deposited, and a resolution is on the agenda, to open a bank account on behalf of WANS.

At the request of Mr. Halpin and Mr. Lefkowitz, Mr. Cecchetto developed a financial summary which he reviewed with the Board Members. Mr. Szabo advised the Board, they can expect a more in-depth review in a few months, and asked them to please advise if there are other details they would like to see included.

Comments:

SCWA provides water for Brown Hill Estates, Orient Point, NY – a small, seasonal community water system that serves 24 homes. This contract is for ongoing maintenance of point of use (POU) household water treatment systems for the removal of nitrate. The POU systems include reverse osmosis and carbon block filters.

In 2021 Water Dynamics Corp. took over for GNS Mermaid who was the previous SCWA Board approved Contractor for this POU maintenance work since 2002. Under this Contract, as with past agreements, the Contractor arranges for access to the customers premises, performs annual maintenance, changes filter cartridges, takes samples and makes necessary repairs to keep the systems operating properly.

The Water Dynamics' bid price received under this Contract represents a 12 percent total increase or 4 percent annual increase over the previous bid price of \$10,120 from Contract No. 7627A bid in June 2019.

As part of AOP testing at the Commercial Blvd well field the Suffolk County Department of Health Services requires the SCWA to continue testing for carboxylic acids. Carboxylic acids can be formed as a by-product of the Advanced Oxidation Process (AOP).

Under our current testing we have detected formic acid at the AOP effluent collection point. We will need to continue monitoring to ensure that this compound is removed by the GAC and does not enter our distribution system. With the planned installation of AOP systems within the next several years it is expected that the requirement for carboxylic acid testing at each site will be required.

Carboxylic acids are measured at low levels, in parts per billion or ppb. Presently, prior to GAC filtration there have been several detections of one of these compounds, formic acid at 10 ppb or greater.

Several laboratories were contacted for pricing, but currently only Eurofins Eaton Analytical performs this analysis.

As part of UCMR2 the SCWA tested for a group of chemicals called nitrosamines. Nitrosamines can be formed as a by-product of the disinfection of drinking water or found as a contaminant in drinking water from manufacturing processes such as for rubber and latex products. The EPA has classified several nitrosamines as probable human carcinogens.

In 2009, 2010, and 2011 the SCWA Laboratory tested the wells required by the UCMR2 regulation. Falcon Drive Well #2 was found to have nitrosamine contamination. For efficiency in-house testing was discontinued in July 2012, and the nitrosamine testing for Falcon Drive was subcontracted. Falcon Drive Well #1 was also found to have nitrosamine contamination.

The wells at Falcon Drive have Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) filter systems and since Falcon Drive #2 is a large capacity well, the water is filtered through two separate GAC filter systems. Nitrosamines are measured at extremely low levels, in parts per trillion or ppt. Presently, prior to GAC filtration there is about 4 ppt of n-nitrosomorpholine in both Well #1 and Well #2.

To continue to monitor the wells and GAC filters at Falcon Drive in 2023, multiple labs were contacted, but pricing could only be obtained from one laboratory which was NYS certified for this analysis:

RESOLVED, the CEO is designated as the Authority's representative to execute any and all other documents, agreements and instruments necessary to effectuate the Gabreski Airport water main easement.

SCWA owns approximately 20.5 acres of property on Rocky Point Road in East Marion. SCWA's property is shown on the attached map. SCWA developed a wellfield, pump station, and tank on its property. While SCWA's property is nearly 2600 feet long, only 350 feet of it, on its southerly portion, have frontage on Rocky Point Road.

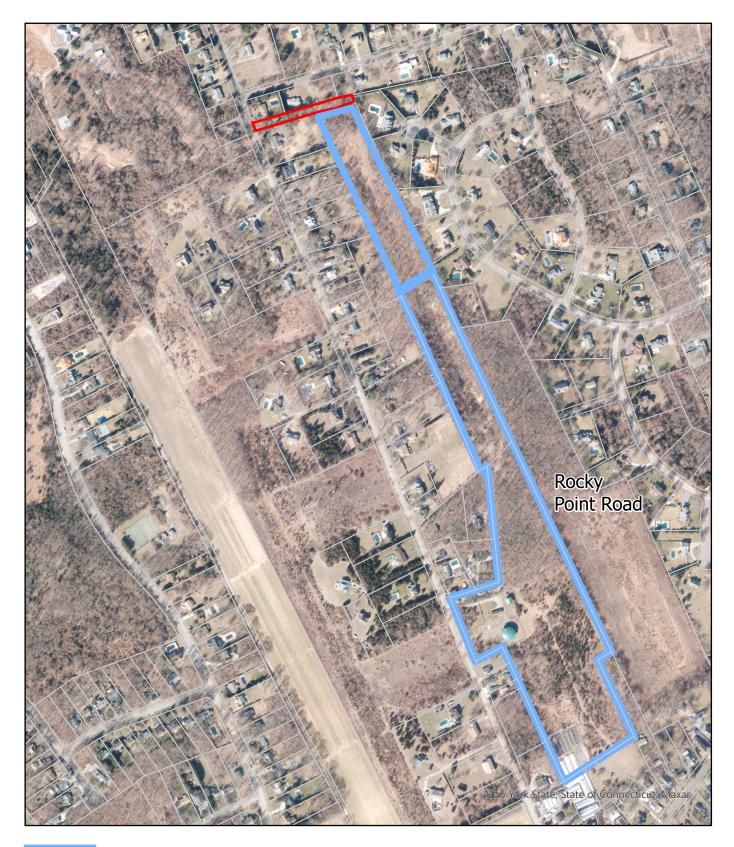
Richard Israel owns a lot adjacent to the SCWA property as shown on the map. His parcel is narrow and not buildable but he represents that could be used to access the SCWA property. He offered to sell his lot to SCWA for \$50,000. It appears that there is only one other unimproved parcel that both fronts on Rocky Point Road and the SCWA property. That parcel is located near the SCWA's property's existing Rocky Point Road frontage and thus does not provide materially different access to the SCWA property.

SCWA commissioned an appraisal of Mr. Israel's lot. By an appraisal report with a valuation date of July 6, 2022, New York State Certified Appraiser David Berger, assigned a value of \$41,000 to the lot.

Mr. Israel claims that another adjacent landowner is willing to purchase his lot but he is committed to selling it to SCWA for \$50,000. He is not willing to accept any less for the lot.

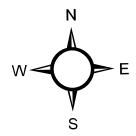
Acquiring the lot would add value to SCWA's property by providing another means of access to it. More importantly the access would be on the north side of the SCWA property, where no current access exists.

Please have the Board consider whether SCWA should purchase the lot for \$50,000 on terms acceptable to the Legal Department, including the ability to develop it for access to the SCWA property. If the purchase is approved, the Board should further authorize you to execute any documents necessary to effect its purchase.

RE: Cooperative Funding Agreement with Town of Riverhead Manorville Water Main Extension Area in Town of Riverhead

As you know, the Authority has been working with the Town of Riverhead regarding the extension of water mains to a group of homes in the Hamlet of Manorville located in the Town of Riverhead whose private wells are subject to contamination. Historically, the Town of Riverhead has tried to be the exclusive public water supply within the Town's boundaries. However, the location and cost of the proposed project make it difficult for the Town to provide water services to the area.

Thus, the Town and the Authority have negotiated a proposed agreement that will provide funding for the proposed project and allow the Town to serve that area if it is able to secure full funding for the project from federal and state grants within a year of the date of the proposed agreement. A copy of the proposed agreement is attached. If the Town is unable to secure such funding, the Authority will serve the area in the same manner that the Authority serves the rest of its system in accordance with its rules and regulations.

If the Town and Authority are able to secure the full actual cost funding for the project from state and federal sources, the Town will make application to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to expand the Riverhead Water District to include the area in question, and the Authority will then provide water in bulk through a master meter to ensure adequate public supplies for the new customers.

The estimated cost for the project is \$9.5 million. Under the proposed agreement, the Town is committing \$2.275 million in congressionally directed funding it has already been awarded for the project. Both the Authority and the Town have submitted applications to the State of New York for additional funding for the project, and both parties will be seeking additional federal funding.

Please have the Authority Board consider the proposed agreement at its October 2022 Board meeting so we may proceed accordingly. Thank you.

Cooperative Agreement Between

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD and THE SUFFOLK COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

AGREEMENT made this <u>day</u> of October, 2022, is between the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, acting in its capacity as governing body of the Town of Riverhead ("Town") and governing body of the Riverhead Water District ("District"), with its principal office at 200 Howell Avenue, Riverhead, New York, 11901, and the Suffolk County Water Authority, a public benefit corporation under the Public Authorities Law, with its principal place of business at 4060 Sunrise Highway, Oakdale, New York 11769 (the "SCWA").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town has identified certain properties with private wells in a portion of the Hamlet of Manorville in the Town of Riverhead as indicated on a Map attached hereto as Exhibit A, (the "Extension Area") that have or may become contaminated with contaminants in concentrations greater than permitted by drinking water regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Extension Area is not within the bounds of the Riverhead Water District (the "District"), and the District does not have a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation ("NYSDEC") public water supply permit to serve the Extension Area, and

WHEREAS, as set forth in the preamble provisions below, subject to adequate funding through grant funding the Town intends to submit an application to the Department of Environmental Conservation for a permit to allow the District to serve the Manorville Area (the "Permit"), and

WHEREAS, the Town has been notified that it will receive \$3.5 Million Dollars of congressionally directed spending to be used to install public water distribution system infrastructure in the Manorville Area and River Road Area, the Manorville water distribution system (herein after for purposes of this Agreement referred to as the "Water Improvement"), and

WHEREAS, since the funding award set forth above, the Town has advocated for additional funds through congressionally directed spending for the construction of the public water distribution system for the Manorville Area and River Road Area and Town and SCWA have each completed applications for funding through WIIA grant program which includes the Manorville Area and continue to explore and pursue other potential funding sources; and WHEREAS, in order to expedite public water service to the Manorville Area, the Town desires to have the SCWA, which has excess water capacity sufficient to serve the Manorville Area, make the improvements to create public water supply distribution system to serve the residents in the Manorville Area (the "Water Improvement") during the pendency of grant applications for funding and subject to receipt of funding equal to SCWA estimated costs for the Improvement Project, Public Water Supply Permit application processes and compliance with procedural prerequisites set forth in Article 12 of the New York State Town Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town agrees to pay a proportionate share of the congressionally directed spending for Water Improvement to the Manorville Area referenced above in an amount not less than \$2,275,000.00, such other appropriate and proportionate share (to the extent required by application and award) other grant awards towards the cost of the water main extension to those identified properties in the Town's Map & Plan for the Manorville Area upon submission of paid invoices to the Town's Department of Finance, and thereafter the Town shall review and disburse the appropriate funds from the above described funding resources to SCWA within a reasonable period of time; and

WHEREAS, to the extent that the Town does not achieve full funding (full funding defined as actual costs to complete the Water Improvement for the Manorville Area less grant funds awarded and provided to Town/District or SCWA for this Water Improvement project) within one year of the date of this Agreement, SCWA shall install water mains to such area in accordance with its rules and regulations and may include a water main surcharge, which surcharge includes the cost of the installation of the water main, connections/tap fee from the water main to the edge of the property line less monies invoiced by SCWA and paid by the Town through its receipt of grant funding, and property owners shall be responsible for costs of connecting from the private service lines (line between the main in the street to the property owner's connection to residence/business); and

WHEREAS, to the extent that the Town achieves full funding for actual costs to complete the Water Improvement for the Manorville Area within one year of the date of this Agreement, SCWA agrees to support the Town's application for the Permit authorizing it to incorporate the Manorville Area into the District's system and upon permit and such other procedural prerequisites, SCWA shall convey the Water Improvement in the Town to the District upon payment by the Town the remaining amounts due and owing for the actual costs of the Water Improvement for the Manorville Area; and **WHEREAS**, the parties represent that they have the power and authority pursuant to law to bind themselves to the provisions hereof.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. The SCWA, using SCWA contractors and vendors, has estimated the cost for the Water Improvement to the Extension Area reflected in the Town's Map & Plan for Proposed Extension 94 "South Manorville" also referred to as "Identified Area" to be \$9,494,261.00, as indicated in the cost estimate attached hereto as Exhibit "A". The SCWA has offered to undertake the Water Improvement, installation of water mains, tap fee, consisting of curb stop, meter, meter vault and service line to the edge of the property line for each identified property in Proposed Extension 94 that requests water service using its contractors and vendors subject to the provisions below.

2. Due to the costs of this Water Improvement to the Extension Area, the Town and/or District has received and continues to make application for congressionally directed funding, and all federal, state, local or third-party grants or other funding available through its Community Development Agency for the estimated cost of the Water Improvement for the Extension Area. Recently, Town/District completed application for funding through WIIA grant program which includes the Manorville Area and SCWA completed application for funding through WIIA grant program for the Manorville Area. Town/District and SCWA continue to explore other potential funding sources. In the event that the Town and/or District receive funding applicable to the Extension Area in an amount equal to the estimate above with credit for funding amounts awarded to Town/District and provided to SCWA for this Water Improvement project and funding amounts awarded to SCWA for this Water Improvement project within one year from the date of this Agreement, the Town agrees to reimburse actual costs not to exceed the estimated costs referenced in (1) above to the SCWA upon submission of paid invoices to the Town's Department of Finance and in turn, the Town shall review and disburse the appropriate funds to the SCWA within a reasonable time period. In addition upon receipt of grant funding equal to the estimated costs referenced in (1) above and with credit for funding amounts awarded to Town/District and provided to SCWA for this Water Improvement project and funding amounts awarded to SCWA for this Water Improvement project within one year, the Town and/or District shall undertake and agree to the provisions recited in paragraphs 4 through 11 of this Agreement. In the event that the Town and/or District, do not receive funding in an amount equal to the estimate costs referenced in paragraph (1) with credit for funding amounts awarded to Town/District and provided to SCWA for this Water Improvement project and funding amounts awarded to SCWA for this Water Improvement project within one year from the date of this Agreement, SCWA shall service the area subject to paragraph 12 set forth below and the Town agrees to commit the all grants and other funding received by the Town and/or District, including but not limited to, all congressionally directed funding, and all federal, state, local or third-party grants or other funding received by the Town or District applicable to the Water Improvement for the Extension Area thereby reducing the cost of the water main surcharge equal to said amount for the identified properties along the route of the water main.

3. Upon the effective date of this Agreement and continuing for a period of one year, the

Town and/or District shall report all grants and other funding received by the Town and/or District applicable to the Water Improvement for the Extension Area and provide SCWA with bi-monthly reports identifying the amount of funding to apply and reduce the cost for the water main surcharge for the identified properties along the route of the water main. In addition, SCWA shall report to Town/District all funding received by SCWA applicable to the Water Improvement for the Extension Area to apply and reduce the cost for the water main surcharge for the identified properties along the route of the water main. SCWA shall submit paid invoices to the Town's Department of Finance, the Town shall review and disburse the appropriate funds to the SCWA within a reasonable time period.

4. The Town, subject to paragraph 2 above and at its own cost and expense, will apply to the NYSDEC for a Permit authorizing the extension of the District to encompass the Extension Area. SCWA consents to the Town representing to the NYSDEC or other entities that the source of water for the Extension Area will be purchased by the District from the SCWA. SCWA will not unreasonably oppose the Town's application to the NYSDEC for such permit. The Town and the District may not represent to the NYSDEC or other entities that SCWA will sell water to the Town or District to be used by the Town or the District to serve areas outside of the Extension Area.

5. If the NYSDEC issues a Permit authorizing the extension of the District to include the Extension Area, the SCWA and the Town will cooperate with each other to transfer the Water Improvement to the District. As a condition of the transfer, the Town or the District must pay for the Water Improvement in full. Upon payment in full, the SCWA will deliver a Bill of Sale from the SCWA to the District for the Water Improvement. SCWA shall provide no representations or warranties of any kind to the Town or District for the Water Improvement. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

6. The Water Improvement shall be and remain the property of the SCWA until payment in full for the Water Improvement is received by the SCWA from the Town or District. Upon receipt of payment in full for the Water Improvement, the SCWA will transfer ownership and possession of the Water Improvement to the District. The SCWA will maintain repair, replace, and operate the Water Improvement until the transfer to the District has been completed. The Town or District will have no obligation to maintain, repair, replace, or operate the Water Improvement has been transferred. SCWA shall establish accounts for each of the premises served in the Extension Area and charge each account holder for services rendered by SCWA according to SCWA Rules and Regulations, as the same may be modified from time to time. SCWA will install fire hydrants in the Extension Area in accordance with requirements of Town, the District, or the local fire protection entity, and the fire district or other fire protection entity shall be obligated to pay the SCWA's fire hydrant rental rates.

7. Upon delivery of the Bill of Sale, the Water Improvement shall be and remain the property of the District. The SCWA shall have no obligations to maintain, repair, replace, or operate the Water Improvement after delivery of the Bill of Sale. The provisions of this

paragraph shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

8. Upon transfer of the Water Improvement to the District, SCWA shall, upon request of the District, continue to supply water to the District until the District develops its own water supply for the Extension Area that is approved and permitted by the NYSDEC. SCWA shall charge the District and the District agrees to pay to the SCWA for the water delivered to the District as follows:

a. For water delivered by SCWA to the District, the SCWA's Standard Water Consumption Rate (Tier I) rate, currently \$2.22 per 1,000 gallons and as the same may be modified from time to time by SCWA.

b. For each premises in the Extension Area receiving water under this Agreement, a quarterly Water Quality and Treatment Charge, currently \$80 per customer per year, and such other charges or fees as the same may be modified from time to time.

SCWA obligations under this paragraph shall terminate upon the District's receipt of a Permit of its own water supply for the Extension Area.

9. On a mutually agreed upon schedule, but in no event, less than quarterly, SCWA shall deliver to the District an invoice for the amounts due to SCWA under paragraph 7, above. The Town or the District shall pay to the SCWA, the amount within 15 days of the invoice. The parties' rights and obligations under this paragraph shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

10. SCWA shall, at its own cost and expense, ensure that the water produced by its system and its public water supply operations complies with and is tested in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and county laws, rules, and regulations (collectively the "Standards").

11. SCWA shall use reasonable care and diligence in providing a constant supply of water in accordance with the Standards. It is expressly agreed that SCWA shall be not liable to the Town or the District for deficiency or failure in the supply of water or the pressure thereof for any cause whatsoever, or for any damage caused thereby, or by the bursting or breaking of any of the Water Improvement after title is transferred to the Town or the District. This paragraph shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

12. In the event that the Town and/or District is unable to secure grant funding, be it congressionally directed funding, and all federal, state, local or third-party grants or other funding applicable to the Water Improvement for the Extension Area, in an amount equal to the estimate set forth in (1) above with credit for funding amounts awarded to Town/District and provided to SCWA for this Water Improvement project and funding amounts awarded to SCWA for this Water Improvement project within one year from the date of this Agreement, the SCWA will charge each of the identified properties a water main surcharge in accordance with the SCWA's rules and regulations, which surcharges includes the cost of the installation of the water main, and connections/tap fee from the water main to the edge of the property line. The water main surcharge is the cost of the project divided by the number of

properties with the identified area accessing public water. The Town and/or District agrees to commit the all grants and other funding received by the Town or the District for the Water Improvement, including but not limited to, all congressionally directed funding, and all federal, state, local or third-party grants or other funding received by the Town or District applicable to the Water Improvement for the Extension Area thereby reducing the cost of the water main surcharge equal to said amount for the identified properties along the route of the water main. The Town and/or District shall have no ownership or obligation to maintain, repair, replace, or operate the Water Improvement. The Water Improvement shall be and remain the property of the SCWA and as such responsible to maintain repair, replace, and operate the Water Improvement. SCWA shall establish accounts for each of the premises served in the Extension Area and charge each account holder for services rendered by SCWA according to SCWA Rules and Regulations, as the same may be modified from time to time. SCWA will install fire hydrants in the Extension Area in accordance with requirements of Town, the District, or the local fire protection entity, and the fire district or other fire protection entity shall be obligated to pay the SCWA's fire hydrant rental rates.

13. Each party hereto shall defend, indemnify and save harmless, to the extent permitted by law, the other party, its respective officers, agents, servants, employees, contractors and representatives against and from all suits, losses, demands, payments, actions, recoveries, judgments and costs of every kind and description and from all damages to which the other party or any of its officers, agents, servants, employees and representatives may be subjected by reason of injury to person or property of others resulting from the implementation of this Agreement by the other party. The aforesaid indemnification shall not be applicable to any liability caused by the acts, omissions, faults, or negligence of the party seeking indemnification.

14. The Town specifically represents that it is duly authorized to enter into this Agreement and bind the Town and the District to the terms hereof, by virtue of a resolution # 2022-673 adopted on September 7th, 2022, a copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof and marked Exhibit B. SCWA specifically represents that it is authorized to enter into this Agreement by virtue of a resolution dated ______, a copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof and marked between the terms hereof.

15. This Agreement is the entire agreement between the parties concerning the Water Improvement and the supply of water to the Extension Area. This Agreement may not be modified except by a writing signed, acknowledged, and duly authorized by each party.

16. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties and their respective successors and assigns.

17. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be binding upon the parties and shall be enforceable as though said invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision were not contained herein, provided, however, that if the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision goes to the heart of this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated, by either party on ten (10) days prior written notice to the other party hereto.

18. Both parties acknowledge that they have had the opportunity to have counsel of their choosing review this Agreement. Regardless of any contrary rule of construction, no provision or alleged ambiguity of this Agreement shall be construed in favor of one of the parties because it was drafted by the other party or their attorney.

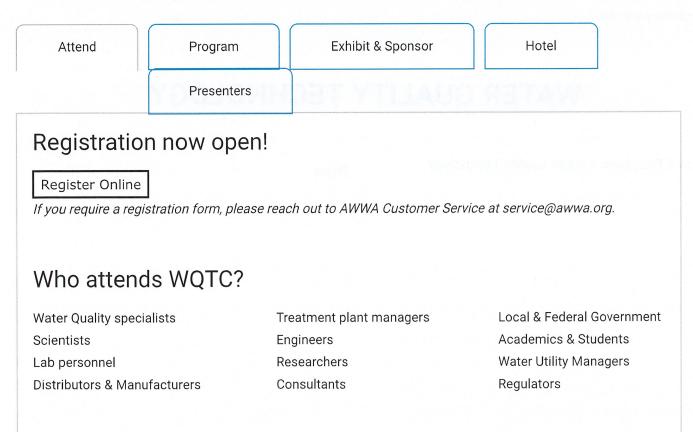

I am seeking approval from the Suffolk County Water Authority Board to transition Samantha Acampora who works as a part-time ecological field specialist in the Science and Stewardship Division of the Pine Barrens Department to a full-time employee. The Central Pine Barrens Commission has sufficient funds in its budget to support this full-time position.

Ms. Acampora has been working for SCWA in the Pine Barrens Department since Spring 2022 on a part-time level participating on prescribed fire burns alongside the seasonal fire crew. In addition, she has been working with our other ecological field specialist as part of a field team in areas related to invasive species removal and monitoring and forest health work. She has been an exemplary staff person that we would like to have in a full-time position. The ecological field specialist position at a part-time level has resulted in staff turnovers after a year or two, with staff leaving to seek full-time employment with benefits elsewhere. We anticipate changing this position to full-time would promote greater stability and longevity of staff employed in this position. We would offer Ms. Acampora a salary of \$60,000 a year.

This position is open due to the unexpected passing of Andrew Skurka in May 2022. Due to staffing needs within the department, this replacement position is necessary. The primary responsibility of this position will be to provide oversight of our pipeline contractors as they perform water main extensions and replacements. The position was posted in June 2022; several candidates were interviewed, and Mr. Meyers is the best candidate for this position. This role will require oversight and coordination with contractors, internal staff and external stakeholders. John's previous role as a Highway Foreman with the Village of Lindenhurst required oversight of roadwork crews, coordinating contractor work and managing multiple priorities on a daily basis, all directly transferrable skills to the role of Pipeline Inspector. Additionally, his familiarity with different aspects of roadway construction including paving and sewer installation will be foundational to his success in the new role. I have no doubt John will succeed in this role.

Joseph Roccaro is SCWA's Water Quality Engineer and provides invaluable expertise to the Authority and directly to our customers by virtue of his knowledge and experience providing solutions and research into treatment of the contaminants that are detected in our groundwater.

Joe's work has spanned more than two decades identifying and piloting various types of innovative treatment. Joe has been a leader, both within the Authority, and to our industry overall, in developing and adapting the use of Advanced Oxidation process (AOP) treatment for the destruction of 1,4 dioxane in drinking water. He has also been spear-heading our efforts to determine the best treatment options for the removal of perfluorinated compounds (PFC's) from our groundwater, and led our piloting of several alternative AOP treatments as part of a grant we received from NYS through the Center for Clean Water Technology (CCWT) at Stony Brook University.

Joe has made multiple professional presentations on behalf of the Authority and has been interviewed by various media outlets to explain how SCWA is combatting these water quality challenges. Joe's current annual salary of \$130,809 is far below his value in the current employment market and for the position and responsibility he holds with his experience and credentials. A recent job offer of approximately \$150,000 underscores the very real danger that SCWA could lose a critically important employee at an extremely vulnerable time in our goal to complete the requisite AOP projects during the deferral time period.

While we are developing current talent in the Engineering department for succession in this area, there is no viable substitute at this time for Mr. Roccaro. We are underway in the start-up of the first of our Phase 1 AOP projects and he is the only person with this experience. Mr. Roccaro enjoys his work at SCWA and has indicated his preference to stay and continue his work here. We are recommending that Mr. Roccaro's annual salary be increased to \$150,000 as fair recognition of his work and expertise and the value of that work to our customers' health.

RE: Promotion and Raise for Wendy Newton Smith

This is a request to have the Board consider a promotion and salary increase for Wendy Newton Smith. Wendy has worked continuously for the Authority in a variety of non-union office positions for approximately 10 years. Currently, her title is Administrative Assistant in the Risk Management Department, and her current annual salary is \$60,029.74. Wendy has a Bachelor of Arts degree from Roanoke College, and she has a paralegal certificate from Adelphi University.

Wendy is responsible managing the database of insurance policies required under vendor and cell carrier contracts, managing school bus and red light camera violations received for Authority-owned vehicles, managing the water buffalo program and providing backup coverage for the Authority's Records Center. Recently, Wendy has done an excellent job providing support for the dioxane litigation with depositions and discovery of records.

With the recent retirement of Mabel Smith, Authority Risk Manager, Wendy will be taking on additional duties and has moved her office location to Great River, further from her home. Mabel's position is not being filled so her duties are being performed by others, including Wendy, who will be administering Authority-caused property damage claims under the guidance of Chas Finello.

Wendy's current salary is significantly below other Authority employees. An Authority Clerk's annual salary is currently \$70,414.50. That salary level is attained after 30 months in the Clerk's position. An Authority Senior Clerk's annual salary is currently \$79,228.50. That salary level is currently attained after 15 years in the Clerk's position. The nature of the office work performed by the Clerks and Senior Clerks is comparable in responsibility to that performed by Wendy, except that Wendy's duties are more independent than the typical Clerk's duties. Neither the Clerk nor the Senior Clerk positions require a four year college degree or a paralegal certificate.

In light of the above, it respectfully requested that Wendy's title be changed to Risk Department Administrator and that her salary be increased to the range of a Senior Clerk. Thank you for your consideration.
