Booklets containing detailed information for all Agenda items were distributed to each Member, Executive Staff and Counsel to the Authority.

At 3:00 p.m. Chairman Halpin called the meeting to order.

Mr. Halpin then opened the meeting for public comment. No Public Comments were received prior to the start of the meeting and before the meeting is adjourned, the email inbox will be checked again.

At this time, Chris Cecchetto, Deputy Chief Financial Officer, presented and

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discussed the Operating & Maintenance and Construction Budgets, as well as the Rate Proposal.

Mr. Halpin presented the minutes of the regular meeting of February 27, 2020, for approval. On motion made by Ms. Devine, duly seconded by Mr. Mattera and unanimously carried, the minutes of the regular meeting held on February 27, 2020, were approved.

At this time, Mr. Halpin requested that Agenda Item 5.a) Budgets; and 9.a) Rate Proposal, be taken out of order.

After a lengthy discussion regarding these items, Mr. Halpin asked for a motion regarding these matters. On motion made by Mr. Bishop, duly seconded by Mr. Mattera, and unanimously carried, it was

(066-03-2020) RESOLVED, To approve the Operating & Maintenance and Construction Budgets for Fiscal Year ending May 31, 2021.

The Members then referred to a request regarding Rules and Regulations. After further explanation of details, and on motion made by Ms. Mercado, duly seconded by Mr. Mattera, the following Resolution was unanimously carried:

(067-03-2020) WHEREAS, The Authority authorized a rate study that was conducted by Municipal & Financial Services Group, and such study was updated with additional information and recommendations of Elizabeth Vassallo, Chief Financial Officer and Christopher Cecchetto, Deputy Chief Financial Officer; and

WHEREAS, based upon recommendations set forth in such rate study as updated with such additional information and recommendations a proposed rate schedule was posted on the Authority's website and a notice of public hearing appeared in the March 23, 2020 issue of Newsday regarding proposed rate schedule, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on March 26, 2020, to consider such rate schedule, now, therefore, be it

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RESOLVED, That the service availability charges, the commodity charges and the charges for wholesale water be amended in accordance with the duly posted rate schedule; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Authority's Rates, Rules and Regulations are hereby amended in accordance with such schedule.

Mr. Szabo referred to contracts scheduled to expire shortly, and he recommended that the Authority exercise its option to extend these contracts in accordance with the letters of recommendation. These items were considered on consent and on motion made by Mr. Bishop, duly seconded by Mr. Mattera, and unanimously carried, it was

(068-03-2020) RESOLVED, To extend for a one-year period beginning June 1, 2020, Contract 7512 for installation of new water service lines and reconnection of service lines (tie-overs) with Asplundh Construction Corp. of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (Group I-West & II-East) in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the contract.

RESOLVED, To extend for a one-year period beginning July 1, 2020, Contract 7518 for furnishing and delivery of with Colonial Hardware Corp. of Springfield, New Jersey (Items 1-4 6, 7), in accordance with the specifications, terms and conditions of the contract.

These transfers will have no impact on the current approved Capital Budget of Eighty-Two Million Seven Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$82,798,000).

FURTHER RESOLVED, To renew the Authority's Cyber Insurance policy through with the Beazley Insurance Company, Inc. with Willis of New York, Inc. aka Willis

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Towers Watson acting as broker at a premium of Nineteen Thousand Five Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$19,513). Willis of New York will receive a commission on this line of coverage rather than a fee from the Authority in the amount of Three Thousand Nine Hundred Four Dollars (\$3,904) which is included in the above premium, for a one-year period beginning April 1, 2020; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, To renew with the Authority's Surety Bonds (Street Opening Permit Bonds) with the Hartford Insurance Company with Willis of New York, Inc. aka Willis Towers Watson acting as broker at an estimated cost of Five Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$5,100). Willis of New York will receive a commission on this line of coverage rather than a fee from the Authority in the estimated amount of \$1,500, for a one-year period beginning April 1, 2020; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, To authorize the Risk Management Department, in consultation with the CEO and Chief Legal Counsel, to settle claims that occur between April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021, and fall within the self-insured policy retention or deductible limits; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, to authorize the Risk Management Department, in consultation with the CEO and General Counsel, to increase/decrease coverage or purchase additional insurance as required by the operations of the Authority during the period April 1, 2020 to April 1, 2021.

(077-03-2020) RESOLVED, To continue with the Authority's Self-Insured Workers Compensation program and to pay all costs to administer the program included but not limited to Claims, Third Party Claim Administration, Excess Liability Insurance, Broker Fees, Workers Compensation Assessments imposed by the State of New York, and any other miscellaneous costs that may arise, at an estimated aggregate cost of \$4.65 million dollars; and be it.

FURTHER RESOLVED, To extend Agreement with Sedgwick Management Services, Inc. to act as Third Party Administrator for Workers Compensation claims for the period April 1, 2020 to April 1, 2023, with the same terms and conditions as last year's agreement. Pricing will increase by 3% over last year's and is itemized in their schedule of costs included with their addendum to last year's agreement; and be it
