The Authority solicited bids for furnishing and delivery of plumbing valves, fittings, pipe, and associated supplies. Three proposals were received. All three vendors did not bid on every individual item. The basis of award by item was cost and specifications of the required part.

United Pipe Nipple bid an unknown manufacturer on Items 5-6, 9-18. No references can be found for this manufacturer or any of these part numbers to compare to the specified material.

Kelly and Hayes was the lower bid on Items 12-13 but bid another manufacturer other than that specified. SCWA has found over the past 20 years that the specified manufacturer for these two items is of far superior quality and lasts longer in the field. Historically, SCWA pays more per item but buys less of the items over the course of a contract. Having to replace less valves saves on labor costs.

Central Islip Plumbing currently holds no additional contracts.

Kelly and Hayes hold one (1) current contract:

Contract No. 8080C– Furnish and Deliver Rigid Electrical Conduit, Fittings & Assoc Electrical Items [Group IV (Items B - I only)] expires February 2026 amount: \$93,059 awarded December 2024. As of 7/22/2024, United Pipe has been paid approximately a total of \$22,207. This contract is currently in its first year.

Contractors' performance on the above-mentioned contracts has been satisfactory.







A Request for Proposal was issued by the Authority seeking proposals for a vendor to perform the electronic scanning of SCWA capital project files and then upload the files to SCWA's computer system. These files will be indexed so they can be easily accessed by end users requiring information contained in the files. (Employees out in the field with laptop access, etc.) Th paper files are currently housed at the C&M office in Oakdale.

After a scorecard review of all twenty-two (22) proposals received (pricing, experience, references, quality of RFP responses), the Construction Maintenance department narrowed the field to five qualified finalists:

Data Management International - \$305,310.00 DataBank IMAX LLC - \$288,687.00 Konica Minolta - \$329,950.00 Ripcord - \$398,049.00 Starpoint Global Services - \$330,140.00

- Scanned images samples were of the highest quality without needing to increase the projected file storage space.
- The proposed project cost is slightly less than the average for the 5 final companies that provided scanning samples

Pursuant to New York State Finance Law Sec 162 for "IMA Secure Document Imagining", the following are preferred sources that were all informed of the RFP. If the any of these vendors were within 15% of the prevailing market rate, they would have received a preference for the award. :

NYSID - \$2,108,020 Fedcap Rehabilitation Services - \$725,028 National Industries for the Blind - \$361,140

After careful review of the submitted proposals from these preferred sources, SCWA determined they did not meet the form, function, and utility requirements necessary for an award, as well as the bid amounts exceeded the cap of fifteen percent above prevailing market rate. For purposes of the review, SCWA determined that the market rate was the average of the five least expensive proposals.

Construction Maintenance recommends awarding RFP No. 1665 as indicated above to Konica Minolta

Konica Minolta has no other contracts with the Authority.

SUBJECT: Renewal of Vision Coverage with Davis Vision

The contract period for our vision benefit plan with Davis Vision is scheduled to end on December 31, 2025. Davis Vision has agreed to a continuation of our current rates for an additional four (4) years.

Davis Vision can offer an enhanced plan, which includes ability to utilize Costco Vision Centers as an in-network provider. Costco is a frequently requested vision center among employees and can offer additional savings on contacts and glasses.

Union employees have been granted the same coverage as our management employees effective 1/1/26 and this will result in a 2% savings annually. Offering the same plan to all employees is estimated to amount to an annual cost of \$89,499.96.

If we elect to move to the enhanced plan with Costco, it is estimated our annual cost would amount to \$93,544.80. This is a 4.5% increase, but with the union plan being eliminated and the additional savings of 2%, the increase for the enhanced plan is brought down to 2.5%.

We also receive an estimate of \$21,500 annually from our retirees and COBRA participants.

Along with complete vision benefits, Davis Vision also provides discounts to enrollees on Lasik Eye Surgery and hearing exams and has a free, intuitive mobile app that allows members to track their benefits, claims history, request insurance cards, find providers and more.

It is our recommendation that we move to the enhanced vision plan with Costco from Davis Vision of Plainview, New York, for a four year period beginning January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2029. If you concur, please add this item to the November Board agenda.

SUBJECT: Renewal of Flexible Spending Account (FSA & DCA) with Ameriflex

Our agreement with Ameriflex, the Flexible Spending Account (FSA) vendor, is up for renewal effective January 1, 2026. Flexible Spending is an *employee funded* benefit now being offered to all employees.

Since the participation rate is expected to increase, with the addition of Union employees, Ameriflex has offered us a discount on the monthly fee per enrollee. In previous years, we have paid \$5.55 per enrollee and Ameriflex has now reduced the price to \$5.05 per enrollee. There is also an annual renewal fee of \$190.00 and an additional \$.50 per enrollee for the My Plan connect service which auto substantiates claims associated with medical and hospital coverage which makes the claim process easier for employees.

There are 50 enrollees at the end of the 2025 plan year. With the inclusion of union employees, we anticipate the enrollment to double. We estimate our approximate annual costs to be \$6,790.

Based on the above information, it is recommended that we continue our FSA program with Ameriflex of Mount Laurel, New Jersey, for a one year period of January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026. If you concur, please add this item to the Board agenda.

SUBJECT: Group Legal Plan- For Management Employees

Met Law (a Metlife Company) provides our Group Legal Plan Services and will expire on January 1, 2026. The Met Law group Legal plan is a voluntary employee-paid benefit currently held by 32 employees. The employee cost for this service is \$21 per month or \$5.25 per paycheck (4 pay checks per month). Met Law requires that a minimum of 5% of eligible employees enroll. Met Law has a network of 14,000 attorneys nationwide with 146 of those attorneys in Suffolk County and the surrounding areas of Long Island. Employees enrolled in this coverage can work with any network attorney on a wide variety of legal services with no out of pocket cost.

Additionally, enrolled employees who work with an out of network attorney on qualified legal services can receive a reimbursement based on a schedule of services from Met Law. There are no annual maximums.

Based on the above information, *it is recommended that we continue to offer the Group Legal Plan through Met Law of Cleveland, Ohio.* If you concur, please add this item to the Board agenda for the November meeting.

SUBJECT: NEW Dental Insurance Carrier- United Health Care

The contract period for our dental benefit plan with MetLife Dental is scheduled to end on December 31, 2025.

MetLife has proposed a 15% rate increase for the 2026 plan year and a 10% rate cap for the 2027 plan year. MetLife is at 106% loss ratio based on claims through August of 2025. MetLife's initial offer was a 25% rate increase for the 2026 plan year but have since reduced this increase to 15% to keep our business. We received 4 proposals that were highly competitive with significant cost savings to the Authority from UHC Dental.

UHC proposed a cost savings of (\$47,940.00/year), which is a 10.4% increase to our current plan with MetLife. UHC's network is also significantly larger than MetLife's network with a 13.2% overall gain and only a 2% loss of providers who are currently in-network with MetLife. MetLife has made no guarantee of a rate cap for 2028. UHC is proposing a 6% rate cap for the following year and 10% rate cap for 2028.

We recommend changing dental insurance providers from MetLife Dental to **UHC Dental**. UHC has matched our current plan completely and is able to increase our current network and minimize the loss of current in-network providers.

Based on the above information, *it is recommended that we offer dental insurance through UHC Dental Insurance for a three-year period of January 1, 2026, to December 31, 2028.* If you agree, please add this item to the Board agenda for the November 20, 2025, meeting.

**SUBJECT:** Increase of medical insurance premium costs for new management

employees effective 1/1/26

During the spring and early summer, SCWA negotiated a new collective bargaining agreement with the Local 393, Utilities union of America. This agreement included a provision that new members who are hired on 1/1/25 and thereafter would be required to contribute 20% of their medical insurance premiums. The CBA also includes a provision that states the following:

The Authority will pay eighty percent (80%) of the cost of the Empire Plan of the New York State Employees' Health Insurance Program for all employees hired on or after January 1, 2026. If the Authority reduces the contribution amount for management employees hired after January 1, 2026, below 20%, the health care contribution of Union employees hired after January 1, 2026, will be reduced to the same percentage.

To ensure fairness and continuity throughout the Authority, SCWA would like to ensure that any new management employees are hired on 1/1/26 and thereafter would also contribute 20% of the cost of their medical insurance premiums. This change will take effect for all new management employees on 1/1/26.

The environmental review of the North Fork Water Main Project is underway. In 2023, SCWA retained Nelson Pope Voorhis to perform the review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA). To date, NPV has prepared and circulated a Long Form Environmental Assessment Form. Following the LEAF distribution, SCWA issued a Positive Declaration and initiated a formal Scoping process. This involved preparing a Draft Scope which identified reasonably anticipated impacts associated with the Project.

SCWA held hearings on June 4, June 10, and June 15, 2025, to receive public comments on the Draft Scope. The hearings were held in the Towns of Southampton, Riverhead, and Southold respectively. Although the Hearings closed, SCWA held the comment period open until June 25. The deadline was twice extended, first until July 11 on SCWA's own motion and then until August 4, at the request of the Town of Riverhead. SCWA received 68 comments on the Draft Scope.

NPV revised the Draft Scope to incorporate the relevant comments which are contained in the proposed Final Scope, attached for your review. The Scope defines the topics to be more fully analyzed in the Environmental Impact Statement on the Project.

I. Please have the Board adopt and issue the Final Scope. A suitable resolution for this action is as follows:

Whereas, the Authority is performing a review of the reasonably anticipated environmental impacts of the North Fork Water Main Project pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and its implementing regulations, (6 NYCRR 617), and

Whereas, on May 9, 2025, the Authority issued a Positive Declaration on the Project and the Authority's consultant prepared a Draft Scope identifying the Project's reasonably anticipated impacts, and

Whereas, the Authority held hearings on June 4, June 10, and June 15, 2025, in the

Towns of Southampton, Riverhead, and Southold respectively to receive public comments on the Draft Scope, and

Whereas, although the comment period on the hearings was set to expire on June 25, it was twice extended, first until July 11 on SCWA's own motion and then until August 4, at the request of the Town of Riverhead, and

Whereas, the Authority received 68 comments on the Draft Scope, and

Whereas, the Authority's consultant prepared the proposed Final Scope which incorporated relevant comments received during the hearings, therefore be it

Resolved. the above recitals are incorporated herein, and be it further

Resolved, the Authority adopts and issues the Final Scope in accordance with the provisions of 6 NYCRR 617.8.

II. To maintain the cadence of the Project's environmental review, the Board may wish to delegate to the CEO or its designee the authority to make and issue any other necessary determinations required under SEQRA. A suitable resolution for this action is as follows:

# FINAL SCOPE SUFFOLK COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY NORTH FORK WATER MAIN PROJECT

Riverside/Flanders to Jamesport/Laurel and East Marion to Orient

### 1.0 Introduction

This document is the Final Scope for the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the proposed Suffolk County Water Authority (SCWA) Riverside/Flanders to Jamesport/Laurel and East Marion to Orient Water Main Extensions. The Final Scope includes a brief project description, project location, and purpose and objectives of the Proposed Action. This Final Scope includes a DEIS outline identifying topics and issues of concern, potential relevant environmental impacts, level of detail and analyses needed, project alternatives to be considered, available resources, and preliminary potential mitigation measures. The Final Scope has been prepared by environmental consultants, Nelson Pope Voorhis (NPV) on behalf of the Project Sponsor, SCWA, and has been guided by project- and site-specific environmental information contained in the Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) Parts 1, 2 and 3/ Determination of Significance and the Positive Declaration adopted by the SCWA. This Final Scope has also been guided by verbal and written comments and questions received from involved and interested agencies, local organizations, and the general public during initial agency coordination and outreach and three advertised public scoping sessions held on:

- June 4, 2025 at the SCWA building in Westhampton Beach;
- June 10, 2025 at the Riverhead Library in downtown Riverhead; and
- June 12, 2025 at the Southold Town Recreation Center in Peconic.

The Draft Scope was made available on SCWA's official website and in hard copy at the locations listed above and was published in the NYSDEC's Environmental Notice Bulletin (ENB) on May 14, 2025. The scoping sessions were advertised in three newspapers of area-wide distribution including:

- Newsday on May 15, 2025 and June 5, 2025;
- Riverhead News-Review on May 15, 2025 and June 5, 2025; and
- The Suffolk Times on May 15, 2025.

An extended written scoping comment period was also provided to allow the public and involved and interested agencies additional time to consider and submit input on the necessary scope and content of the DEIS. The written scoping comment period was extended from the initial closing date of June 29, 2025 to July 11, 2025 and a second time at the request of the Town of Riverhead, to August 4, 2025, providing over two months from the time the Draft Scope was accepted by the Lead Agency and notices were published in the NYSDEC's ENB and in area newspapers scheduling public scoping sessions, requesting input, and extending the written comment period. A total of 18 federal, state, regional, county, and local agencies and seven local non-agency private organizations were sent notices indicating the filing of a Positive Declaration under SEQRA, the preparation and availability of the FEAF Parts 1, 2 and 3 and Draft Scope for review and consideration, the dates, times and locations for the three public scoping sessions and written comment period, and SCWA contact information for submission of written comments.

This Final Scope was prepared in accordance with the standards and requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617 State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) §617.8 "Scoping" and §617.9(b) "Environmental impact statement content."

# 2.0 Brief Description of Proposed Action and Water Main Routes

Phase 1: Riverside-Flanders to Jamesport-Laurel Water Main Project: Installation of approximately 43,052± linear feet (LF) (8.15± miles) of 24-inch diameter ductile iron transmission water main within existing street and highway rights-of-way (ROWs) beginning at the intersection of Flanders Road (SR 24) and Cross River Drive (CR 105) between the Hamlets of Riverside and Flanders in the Town of Southampton where it will connect to an existing SCWA distribution main, then proceeding north along Cross River Drive (CR 105), under the Peconic River/ Peconic Estuary using directional drilling, and north along Cross River Drive in the Town of Riverhead over a total of 3.77± miles until its intersection with Northville Turnpike (CR 43).

From there, the proposed water main will extend 0.53± miles to the northeast along Northville Turnpike to the intersection of Northville Turnpike and Sound Avenue, then east (2.42± miles) along Sound Avenue within Riverhead to Pier Avenue and a proposed booster station located 200+ feet north of the intersection of Sound Avenue and Pier Avenue on a vacant 1.5-acre previously partially cleared and disturbed SCWA-owned property identified as Suffolk County Tax Map: District 600; Section 8; Block 3; Lot 1.9).

Continuing south from the proposed Pier Avenue booster station then east along Sound Avenue a distance of 1.39± miles to a point south of the Sound Avenue - Jamesport Wellfield and Pump Station at the Town of Riverhead and Town of Southold municipal boundary (Jamesport-Laurel) and SCWA Distribution Area 30 and an existing 16-inch SCWA service main. See attached figures and preliminary engineering plans.

The proposed Riverside/Flanders to Jamesport/Laurel main will convey water at a rate of up to 6,000 gallons per minute (gpm). A total of 3,322± LF (0.63± miles) of the main will be installed using directional drilling, including 1,950± LF beneath the Peconic River, 1,221± LF beneath the Long Island Railroad and Hubbard Avenue, and 171± LF beneath Main Road. Approximately 39,730± LF (7.52 miles) will be installed and backfilled by open cut trenching.

<u>Phase 2</u>: East Marion to Orient Water Main Project: Phase 2 involves long-range planning for a possible future 20,000± linear-foot (3.79-mile) water main extension consisting of a combination of 6, 8 and 12-inch diameter mains between East Marion and Orient in the Town of Southold to potentially serve residential and non-residential premises in a Suffolk County Department of Health Services Priority Area in the Hamlet of Orient, south of Sound Avenue along the east shore of Orient Harbor as shown on the attached aerial photographs (Figures 2-1 and 2-2). This improvement would extend east along Main Road (SR 25) from East Marion, just west of Dam Pond a distance of 1.90± miles) to the intersection of Tabor Road, south along Tabor Road and down several streets in this neighborhood, including parts of Orchard Street, Navy Street, King Street, Vincent Street, Willow Street, Fletcher Street, Skippers Lane, Harbor River Road, and Oyster Ponds Lane.

An estimated 1,115± linear feet of the East Marion to Orient main will be installed underground via directional drill and the remainder will be installed using trenching. The 1,115± feet of directional drills includes one 445-foot section along Sound Avenue in East Marion, two 200-foot sections along Main Road where culverts are located along Main Road, 95± linear feet from that the intersection of Main Road and Oyster Ponds Lane, 85± feet at the intersection of Main Road and Village Lane, and 90± linear feet at the intersection Main Road and Tabor Road. Peak flow is estimated to be 250 gpm. Service lines will be installed to premises in the Priority Area.

### Main Installation

The proposed water main installations will be located primarily within the paved and unpaved shoulders of street rights-of-way along the identified route consisting primarily of County roads with directional drill crossings beneath the Peconic River, Hubbard Avenue, LIRR and Main Road for the Riverside/Flanders to Jamesport/Laurel route as explained above. (Sections of main to be directionally drilled are shown in blue and sections to be trenched are shown in red on the attached figures.) The typical width of disturbance for main installations within trenches in paved areas will be approximately three feet (3 ft.) and up to 57 inches in depth below ground, unless otherwise affected by other underground utilities, and up to 10 feet of disturbance in shoulder areas, including equipment and materials staging areas. The daily main installation rate for trenched sections is estimated to be 300 to 400 feet/day and up to 600 feet/day or more on long stretches within grassed shoulder areas such as along sections of Cross River Drive (CR 105). The depths of directional drillings are much deeper, reaching a depth of 30+ feet below the Peconic River. The proposed directional drill under the Peconic will consist of a 1,633± foot (horizontal

distance) 24-inch diameter high-density polyethylene pipe (H.D.P.E.) which will be encased in bentonite clay.

## **Booster Station**

A booster station will be constructed to serve the proposed Riverside/Flanders to Jamesport/ Laurel main extension. The booster station will be 405± SF in area and is proposed on part of a vacant 1.5-acre property owned by SCWA. The booster station property is located approximately 200 feet north of the intersection of Sound Avenue and Pier Road on the west side of Pier Road and is identified as SCTM: 600-8-3-1.9. See attached figures. The property was partially cleared in the past but had become overgrown again, mostly with invasive species and this previously cleared area was recently mowed for access and maintenance purposes. Prior to construction an estimated 15,688.9 SF (0.36 acres) of clearing including 12,490.5 SF (0.287 acres) of formerly cleared successional and invasive brush and 3,198.3 SF (0.073 acres) of woodlands will be necessary. The booster station will be set back from the street, a distance of 97± feet and will be 40+ feet from the closest adjacent property line. A 16-inch main will be installed onsite from Pier Avenue to the booster station and a 16-inch main will be installed onsite from the booster station back to Pier Avenue. A short asphalt driveway and a small asphalt vehicle parking area for a few cars or trucks will also be constructed to provide access to the station and off-street parking for periodic inspections and maintenance. The access driveway will be located at the same location as the existing driveway entrance and gate near the northeast corner of the property. A generator with sound attenuating enclosure will be provided to ensure ongoing service in the event of a power failure.

No new wells are proposed or needed. SCWA will utilize excess capacity that is available in SCWA's South Shore Low Zone.

### 3.0 Purpose and Objectives

The purpose and objectives of the Proposed Actions are to:

- 1. Provide a long-term solution to the limited supply of potable drinking water on the North Fork by supplementing the existing SCWA system with water sources that will have minimal impacts on and from the salt water interface and replenish and rehabilitate the local aquifer system with the water conveyed to the area.
- 2. Deliver high quality drinking water from SCWA's South Shore Low Zone.
- 3. Create a substantial interconnection between the Southold system and the SCWA distribution system to the west thereby increasing overall system reliability.
- 4. Provide a sufficient quantity of high-quality potable water to all current and future SCWA customers along the proposed route within the Town of Southold with minimal impacts on the aquifer system.

- 5. Ensure a suitable volume of groundwater and pressure for firefighting, agricultural irrigation, homes and other land uses.
- 6. Offset future capital costs of purchasing land and developing multiple smaller well fields that will in all likelihood require elaborate treatment systems in order to remove contaminants.
- 7. Reduce the cost associated with maintaining numerous low-capacity wells, or in some cases take well fields with costly water treatment systems off-line, that currently comprise the Southold Low water supply system.

The DEIS environmental analysis will begin, by first reviewing the completed EAF Parts 1, 2 and 3 (Determination of Significance/Positive Declaration) and the approved Final Scope for this environmental assessment after public scoping has concluded. The NPV team will examine plans provided by SCWA and other available information in detail and conduct a field visit to gain greater familiarity with the routing and its surroundings for the purposes of fully understanding existing environmental conditions and the potential impacts that could result from the installation of public water mains. The Team will prepare essential maps depicting soil types, topography, freshwater and tidal wetlands, rare, threatened or endangered ecological resources, cultural resources, coastal resources, established agricultural and other special districts, and other essential information as needed and will submit information requests to the NYS Natural Heritage Program (NHP), the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP), and other involved agencies. These resources will be used to evaluate the proposed routing and identify any significant potential adverse impacts of concern. NPV will coordinate with SCWA, and other involved agencies with permitting or approval authority to discuss the details of the proposed project, discuss any concerns and assist in identification of necessary analyses and mitigation options, as necessary.

The environmental review will identify the project's SEQRA classification, sensitive environmental resources within, immediately adjacent to or near each project's path that could be impacted, consider the required work to be performed to complete the projects and operate the mains and booster station, determine the potential impacts on natural and man-made resources, and identify any feasible methods and techniques to prevent or suitably mitigate potential environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable. The proposed assessment and environmental review process will fully comply with the requirements of SEQRA and its implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 617, as well as all applicable standards and requirements of available funding resource programs. Review will also include the identification of all Involved agencies including those responsible for funding, undertaking, approving, permitting or otherwise have review authority under SEQRA. NPV will assist SCWA with any required noticing and filing requirements, as appropriate, and will meet in person, videoconference or audioconference with SCWA representatives as necessary throughout the process.

The DEIS will include study of alternative routes, including a southern option along State Route 25.

## 4.0 Potential Impacts and Issues for Review

Potential impacts and topics for review include impacts on land and soil, groundwater and drinking water quality and supplies, wetlands, surface water bodies and underwater land, traffic and worker safety, historic and archaeological resources, plants and animals including threatened, endangered and other listed species, agricultural land, sensitive land uses, cumulative impacts and growth inducing impacts. The following is a list of the potential adverse impact topics to be addressed in the DEIS based on the Positive Declaration and project scoping.

### Impact on Land

- Work in paved portions of roadway versus unpaved shoulder areas (if any), management and disposition of any excess excavated soil and removed pavement and any vegetation;
- Temporary storage and staging of equipment and materials;
- Impact of any clearing of land in shoulder areas and in areas disturbed by directional drilling, equipment staging and other disturbances (if any);
- Impacts on or from topography;
- Impact on or from soils;
- Handling and management of excess excavated soil or fluids from trenching or removal from directional drills;
- Impact on land uses and agricultural lands, farming activities, and agricultural districts;
- Duration of project; and
- Any inducement of growth and development and associated impacts.

## Impacts on Surface Water, Wetlands, and Groundwater

- Waterbody, wetland crossings, directional drilling in underwater lands of the Peconic River, possible dewatering and directional drill discharges;
- Work within NYSDEC freshwater or tidal wetlands and within upland jurisdictional areas;
- Surface water quality impacts such as from soil erosion and sedimentation or increased runoff, temporary changes in runoff directions, and/or waterbody turbidity;
- Consistency with Local Waterfront Revitalization Plans;
- Impacts on Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat(s);
- Depth of water main installations versus depth of groundwater table and whether there is any need for dewatering, and if so, the disposition of water if dewatering is required including an inadvertent return plan for directional drills, if needed;

- Whether a Water Withdrawal or Long Island Well Permit will be required per NYSCRR Part 601 and 602;
- Impact on the groundwater source/supply capacity;
- Delivery of clean fresh groundwater from an area of abundant supply including areas that
  may be subject to saltwater intrusion, particularly in Orient and impacts to the Orient
  aquifer from any increases in water discharge; and
- Impact on land from any permanent structures such as pump/booster stations including noise, vibrations, and visual impacts and impact on the existing groundwater wells of SCWA and whether any new wells will be required.

# **Impact on Ecological Resources**

• Impact on rare, threatened, endangered, or common vegetation and wildlife species, or critical environmental areas, or wildlife habitat from any necessary clearing.

# **Impact on Transportation**

- Temporary disruption or impact on traffic activity and flow along affected roadways
  including temporary delays, potential traffic/ pedestrian/ bicyclist/ worker and public
  safety issues while construction is underway including impacts on or need for avoidance
  or proper handling of daily commuter traffic, peak summer and fall traffic, festival traffic,
  and emergency vehicle traffic (police, fire, ambulance), and scheduling.
- Need for temporary lane closures in some work areas, traffic calming, traffic signage, traffic cones or barrels, detours (if and where necessary or beneficial), flag persons; street intersection crossings, crossing beneath the LIRR, work occurring during heavier seasonal traffic activity, and during peak traffic hours on work days, anticipated progress in feet/day and equipment staging, potential damage or conflicts with other utilities along route (water mains, underground and overhead utilities) or drainage.
- Ability to mitigate such impacts through an alternative route.

### **Impact on Historic and Archaeological Resources**

- The proposed action including main installation and booster station construction may occur wholly or partially within, or substantially contiguous to, buildings, archaeological sites or districts which is listed on the National or State Register of Historical Places, or that has been determined by the Commissioner of the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) to be eligible for listing on the State Register of Historic Places.
- The proposed action may occur wholly or partially within, or substantially contiguous to, an area designated as sensitive for archaeological sites on the NY State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) archaeological site inventory.

#### Impact from Noise, Odor or Light

 Potential temporary and intermittent noise from trench excavations and backfilling, installation of mains, delivery and staging of pipe/materials and equipment, directional drilling. Noise, vibrations, generator exhausts, outdoor lighting (if any) in construction zones or at booster station, and visual impacts from construction and operation of booster station.

#### Impact on Human Health

• The proposed action is located within 1,500 feet of a school, hospital, licensed day care center, group home, nursing home and/or retirement community.

#### **Consistency with Community and Other Plans**

- The proposed action is located in an area characterized by low and moderate density development that will require new or expanded public infrastructure.
- The Towns of Riverhead and Southold have raised concerns that the proposed action (installation of a public water main) may induce secondary development or will be growth inducing (e.g., supporting residential or commercial development not included in the proposed action).
- 2025 Suffolk County Water Authority Strategic Plan and 2020 Suffolk County Comprehensive Water Resources Management Plan.

## **Other Environmental Impacts**

 Assessment of growth inducing and/or cumulative impacts that may be associated with the project as a result of providing a clean and suitable supply of water to customers as required by SEQRA.

## 5.0 Draft Environmental Impact Statement Organization and Content

The DEIS will include a project description, location, benefits and objectives, list of required approvals, inventory of existing environmental conditions, assessment of potential environmental impacts, plans to prevent, avoid or suitably mitigate identified potential impacts, review of possible alternatives that are feasible, considering the objectives and capabilities of the project sponsor, and based upon the information and analyses provided, assist in the SCWA's final determination of impact and the appropriateness of moving forward with the project. The Final Scope also identifies those topics or issues that were determined to be irrelevant and any potential impacts that were found to be insignificant. The DEIS will include text, tables, figures, maps and supporting information to constitute a thorough analysis with supporting documentation. The scope of the proposed DEIS is as follows:

## 7.0 Extent and Quality of Information Existing and Needed

As required under SEQRA, the DEIS should include "a statement and evaluation of potential significant adverse impacts at a level of detail that reflects the severity of the impacts and the reasonable likelihood of their occurrence." Included in this evaluation will be reasonably related short-term and long-term impacts, cumulative impacts, growth inducing impacts and other required sections identified in **Section 4.0** of this scoping document. This section further describes the level of analysis and the type of analysis expected with respect to the key environmental impacts of the project as outlined in the Lead Agency's Positive Declaration. Each major section is followed by a description of the extent and quality of information needed to perform the evaluation of each of the impacted resources.

Information sources for the DEIS include, but are not limited to the following as applicable: SCWA engineering main installation plans, SCWA Engineering Report, test hole logs, and other SCWA studies and resources as applicable and available; Soil Survey of Suffolk County, NY; Natural Resources Conservation Service website and database; LIDAR and USGS topographic maps; NYSDEC freshwater and tidal wetland maps; 2020 Suffolk County Groundwater Management Zone Map; Suffolk County Groundwater Contour Map; 2025 Suffolk County Water Authority Strategic Plan; 2020 Suffolk County Comprehensive Water Resources Management Plan (SCCWRMP); 2025 Orient Water Resources Study report; applicable available USGS reports; July 15, 2025 letter from Gregson Pigoff, MD, MPH Commissioner of the Suffolk County Department of Health Services' Drinking Water Quality testing results for the Town of Southold; the Peconic Estuary Partnership's most recent Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan (CCMP); Agricultural Districts Map; Golden Nematode Handbook, Survey, Laboratory, Control, and Quarantine Procedures, Significant Coastal Fish & Wildlife Areas maps and reports; Central Pine Barrens Comprehensive Land Use Plan, Town of Southold LWRP; Critical Environmental Areas maps; Suffolk County Water Authority Distribution Systems Maps and Annual Drinking Water Quality Reports and flow data; Correspondence from involved and interested agencies and the public; SEQRA Environmental Assessment Forms Parts 1, 2 and 3/Determination of Significance and the County's adopted SEQRA Positive Declaration for this project; NYSDEC's Environmental Mapper database, Spills and Site Remediation database; adopted Town comprehensive and other applicable plans; 2015 Comprehensive Water Resources Management Plan for Suffolk County; NYS Office of Parks Recreation and Historic Preservation's Cultural Resources Information System (CRIS); NYSDEC Natural Heritage Program survey information; NYSDEC Ecological Communities publication (Edinger et al., 2013); Breeding Bird Survey; input from consultations with service providers and input from the community; information gathered during site and area inspections; and other sources as needed and available.

#### 8.0 Initial Identification of Mitigations

Preliminary mitigations include the use of standard erosion and sedimentation controls, removal and proper disposal of any excess soil, proper scheduling, and traffic flow and safety controls such as the use of flagmen, traffic signage, use of pylons/barrels, detours and lighting if necessary, properly staging work areas, road resurfacing and shoulder area restoration, etc. A detailed impact analysis and appropriate impact prevention and mitigation strategies will be developed based on the extensive information and data to be collected, field inspections and analyses to be conducted, and input received from various resources, agencies and the public during the DEIS preparation and review stages. These analyses and determinations will be further expanded or enhanced as needed during the FEIS preparation and Findings stages of the SEQRA review.

## 9.0 Identification of Information and Data to be Included in the Appendices

Information and data to be included in the appendices include the final Long EAF Parts 1, 2, 3 and Determination of Significance; approved Final Scope; original correspondences such as from other agencies or community service providers that will be addressed in the DEIS; highly technical or lengthy reports, studies or analyses; raw data (e.g., water quality data) or lengthy in-depth calculations; water main construction plans; and similar documents that must be presented in their entirety, will be summarized in the text of the EIS and, if that technical material must be included in the document, it will be included as an appendix.

## 10.0 Issues or Topics Not Included

1. One commenter asked if the valuation of properties will increase due to the availability of water since increased land evaluation increases the cost of our land preservation efforts.

Page 114, Question No. 9 of the NYSDEC's 2020 SEQR Handbook, Fourth Edition asks, "[a]re there economic or social factors which are inappropriate for inclusion in an EIS?"

The Handbook responds by noting that:

"Purely economic arguments have been disallowed by the courts as a basis for agency conclusions when concluding a SEQR review by developing Findings. Therefore, potential effects that a proposed project may have in drawing customers and profits away from established enterprises (commonly known as "competitive impacts"), a possible reduction of property values in a community, or a potential economic disadvantage caused by competition or speculative economic loss, are not environmental factors."

Based on the above response and assessment of increased property values is considered out of scope for an environmental review.

2. There is an EAF Part 1 dated 7/29/24 and another one dated 4/30/25. What's the difference?

The EAF Part 1 that was used to prepare the duly accepted EAF Parts 2 and 3 (May 6, 2025), adopt the Determination of Significance (Positive Declaration) (executed May 9, 2025), prepare the Draft and Final Scoping documents, and is used as a basis for the DEIS is the April 30, 2025 EAF Part 1. Any changes to the EAF Part 1 between July 29, 2024 and April 30, 2025, can be determined by reviewing the two documents.

3. Explain the issue of segmentation and why the two extensions are linked, the benefit of that.

SCWA currently proposes the implementation of Phase 1 (Riverhead/Flanders to Jamesport/Laurel) after the SEQRA process and any other pre construction requirements have been completed, while Phase 2 involves long-range planning for a possible future 20,000± linear-foot (3.79-mile) water main extension (East Marion to Orient Village). The purpose of reviewing the two phases together, regardless of their specific elements, conditions, and scheduling, is to ensure the most comprehensive and holistic environmental review possible and to identify, prevent, or suitably mitigate all significant potential environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable.

4. How might the future development and water supply for EPCAL factor into an analysis of community benefits?

EPCAL is outside of the project study area and is not expected to be significantly or adversely impacted by the currently proposed project or its use of water and is therefore outside the scope of this environmental review.

5. Other possible alternatives were raised by the public during the scoping process including sole use of water conservation efforts, interconnections with Riverhead Water District, use of a Riverhead Water District property to locate the proposed booster station, and an alternative route for main installation.

As per 6 NYCRR Part 617, Section 617 the project sponsor must consider "reasonable alternatives to the action that are feasible, considering the objectives and capabilities of the project sponsor." SCWA through its years of planning and analyses and consideration of recent input provided during project scoping identified two alternatives that it deems to be feasible, based on its objectives and capabilities. These include the "No Action Alternative" and an alternative route identified as the "Riverside/Flanders to Laurel (south route)." See **Section 5.0** of the DEIS outline above.

One speaker suggested using water conservation methods as an alternative. SCWA currently implements a water conservation program which will be discussed in the DEIS and additional measures may be considered, but this alone will not address the project sponsor's goals and objectives and is therefore not considered a feasible alternative to the project. Other alternatives raised were interconnection with the Riverhead Water District, locating the booster station a Riverhead Water District site in Northville instead of on the currently proposed SCWA property. Each of these alternatives have been considered by SCWA as project sponsor and lead agency and were determined to be nonviable alternatives. The scope includes an alternative a long Main Road (south route).

- 6. Comments were received suggesting that comprehensive area wide traffic impact studies, air quality impact analyses to assess air impacts from stop-and-go traffic, impacts on police, EMS, and fire department responses, interruptions to agricultural activities such as tractors that may use local streets during construction, and cumulative impacts from potentially numerous other construction projects or future development in the region. In depth comprehensive region wide studies such as these are not practical, viable, or feasible and not expected to be beneficial for this type of project. Instead related impacts will be assessed, prevented or mitigated to the maximum extent practicable through the identification of the numerous standard and additionally identified (as practical) construction-related processes and procedures used to mitigate impacts from similar street utility or street construction and repair projects. This would include but is not necessarily limited to: construction scheduling (season, day of week, hour of day or night based on section and scheduling), temporary lane closures in some work areas, traffic calming methods, traffic signage, installation of traffic cones or barrels, detours (if and where necessary or beneficial), use of flag persons with bright and reflective vests, proper staging of equipment and materials, road resurfacing and shoulder area restoration/ seeding as soon as possible after completion of a section, turning off construction equipment when not in use, dust controls, prevention of unnecessary blocking of driveways or intersecting, streets, etc.
- 7. Please explain how the Southampton/Riverside Town sewage treatment plant will affect the water source in Flanders. This is out of the scope because the Project will have no foreseeable impact on the Town's Riverside STP.

The Town of Southampton included a comprehensive assessment of existing conditions, potential impacts and mitigations for the referenced project including the preparation of a Supplemental DGEIS, Supplemental FGEIS, and the Town Board adopted a Findings Statement finding concluding that the Town and SGEIS:

- considered the relevant environmental impacts, facts and conclusions disclosed in the SDGEIS, SFGEIS, and supplemental Findings Statement;
- 2) weighed and balanced the relevant environmental impacts with social, economic and other considerations;
- 3) met the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617;
- 4) provided a rationale for its decision; and
- 5) found that consistent with social, economic and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives available, the action described [therein] is one that avoids or minimizes adverse environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable, and that adverse environmental impacts will be avoided or minimized to the maximum extent practicable by incorporating as conditions to the decision those mitigation measures that were identified as practicable during the environmental review process.

Specifically, as concluded in part in Finding 2 of the Town of Southampton Town Board's executed April 23, 2024 Findings Statement and supporting documentation:

The Proposed Action will not have significant adverse impacts on water resources, including surface waters, wetlands, and groundwater.


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



SCWA NORTH FORK WATER MAI	IN PROJECT






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# DIRECTIONAL DRILL PLAN AND CROSS SECTION CROSS RIVER DRIVE AT MAIN ROAD (SR 25)







## BOOSTER STATION PLAN PIER AVENUE, NORTHVILLE, NY





**WHEREAS**, Suffolk County Water Authority "SCWA" is public benefit corporation subject to Title 4, Article 5 of the New York Public Authorities Law.

WHEREAS, SCWA's purpose is to supply water to domestic, commercial and public properties at retail and to individual consumers within Suffolk County, which is deemed to be an essential government function.

WHEREAS, SCWA is Long Island's largest public water provider serving potable water to 1.2 million Suffolk County residents and is one of the largest groundwater suppliers in the country.

WHEREAS, New York State "determined and declared that the [SCWA] and the carrying out of its powers, purposes and duties are in all respects for the benefit of the people of the county of Suffolk and the state of New York, for the improvement of their health, welfare and prosperity and that the said purposes are public purposes and that the authority is and will be performing an essential governmental function in the exercise of the powers conferred" by the State. N.Y. Pub. Auth. L. §1077(3).

WHEREAS, SCWA is proposing to undertake the North Fork Water Main Project ("Project") because water demand on the North Fork continues to increase despite conservation efforts to increase the supply of public water to its customers in Southold. Excessive demand strains infrastructure and over-pumping existing wells risks saltwater entering the freshwater aquifer, limiting expansion. Water supply from existing wells is vulnerable to contamination.

WHEREAS, the Project will consist of installation of 8.15 miles of 24" ductile iron water main within existing street rights-of-way from Flanders to the Southold Town line, together with a booster station at Pier Avenue in the Town of Riverhead. No new wells will be installed. Phase 2 involves long-range planning for a possible future 3.79-mile water main extension consisting of a combination of 6, 8 and 12-inch diameter mains between East Marion and Orient in the Town of Southold.

WHEREAS, SCWA developed the proposed Project to provide a long-term solution to the limited supply of potable drinking water in SCWA's Southold system by supplementing the existing SCWA system with water sources that will have minimal impacts on the salt water interface and replenish and rehabilitate the local aquifer system with the water conveyed to the area; to create a substantial interconnection between the Southold system and the SCWA distribution system to the west thereby increasing overall system reliability; to ensure water availability for consumption, residential and non-residential purposes, and firefighting uses; to provide a sufficient quantity of high-quality potable water to SCWA customers within the Town of Southold; and to reduce the environmental impact of maintaining numerous low-capacity wells that currently serve the Southold Low water supply system.

WHEREAS, SCWA designated itself as lead agency for the purpose of undertaking environmental review for the Project in accordance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), a designation that was upheld by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation following objections by the Towns of Riverhead and Southold.

**WHEREAS**, the Project is being undertaken in the Towns of Southampton, Riverhead and Southold and SCWA must consider whether its activities in furtherance of the Project are immune from local review in accordance with the decision rendered by the Court of Appeals in *Matter of the County of Monroe v. City of Rochester*, 72 N.Y.2d 338 (1988) ("*Monroe*").

**WHEREAS**, SCWA duly noticed and held public hearings on October 7, 8 and 9, 2025 concerning its immunity from local zoning under *Monroe*.

**WHEREAS**, comments were received from the Town Supervisor for the Town of Southold, the Town Supervisor for the Town of Riverhead, Town Board members from the Towns of Riverhead and Southold, and residents of the Towns of Riverhead and Southold.

**WHEREAS**, comments concerned the need for the Project, the environmental impacts associated with the Project, the potential for additional development that would result from the Project, the Town of Riverhead's own *Monroe* determination, the importance of local control.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the SCWA makes the following Findings and Determination:

- New York Courts have long held that when one governmental entity is conducting land use activities in another jurisdiction it may be entitled to a qualified immunity.
- In the *Monroe* case, the court developed a new test for determining these issues. That court required a balancing test using nine factors. Those nine factors are:
  - a. the nature and scope of the instrumentality seeking immunity;
  - b. the kind of function or land use involved;
  - c. the extent of the public interest to be served by the function or use;
  - d. the effect local land use regulation would have upon the enterprise;
  - e. the impact upon legitimate local interests;
  - f. the applicant's legislative grant of authority;
  - g. alternative locations for the facility in less restrictive zoning areas;
  - h. alternative methods of providing the needed improvement; and
  - i. the degree of intergovernmental participation in the project development process; and an opportunity to be heard.
- In applying these tests, it is not necessary that all nine factors favor immunity. One factor could be more influential than another or may be so significant as to completely overshadow all others. Moreover, certain factors, such as the overriding public purpose, have more weight than others.
- Despite public comments to the contrary, the court decision in *Village of Munsey Park v. Manhasset-Lakeville Water District*, 150 A.D.3d 969 (2d Dept. 2017) held that the

application of the <u>Monroe</u> balancing test is not within the exclusive province of the host entity, and, as a result, it is appropriate for SCWA to undertake its own <u>Monroe</u> analysis.

• Analysis of the *Monroe* factors in this case show that SCWA's activities are undisputably immune from local municipal jurisdiction.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that based on the forgegoing, the statement and comments received at the public hearings and during the written comment period, the SCWA finds with respect to the nine (9) *Monroe* factors as follows:

#### • The Nature and Scope of the Instrumentality Seeking Immunity

SCWA is a public benefit corporation operating under the authority of the New York State Public Authorities Law. The purpose of SCWA is to supply water for domestic, commercial, and public purposes at retail to individual consumers within Suffolk County. See N.Y. Pub. Auth. L. Section §1078(4)(a). Furthermore, the SCWA and "the carrying out of its powers, purposes and duties are in all respects for the benefit of the people of the county of Suffolk and the state of New York, for the improvement of their health, welfare and prosperity and that the said purposes are public purposes and that [SCWA] will be performing an essential governmental function in the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by this title." N.Y. Pub. Auth. L. §1077(3).

Accordingly, the Project, which seeks to provide water to individual consumers in Suffolk County is an essential governmental function and the SCWA as a regional authority has legal supremacy over local municipalities in connection with the provision of water to the individual consumers in Suffolk County. *See County of Herkimer v. Village of Herkimer*, 51 Misc. 3d 516, 536, 25 N.Y.S.3d 839, 854 (Sup. Ct. Herkimer Cty. 2016)("it would be anomalous to allow a small village to impede the County in the performance of an essential governmental duty for the benefit of the health and welfare of residents of the entire County").

In fact, SCWA operates in ten (10) towns and approximately thirty-three (33) villages within Suffolk County. If SCWA is subject to local municipal zoning codes, then it would be subject to forty-three (43) different zoning codes. This would be untenable and would severely hamper SCWA's ability to carry out its purpose of providing drinking water to the residents of Suffolk County, which has been deemed to be an essential government function.

Therefore, the fact that SCWA is a public authority created and governed by enabling legislation adopted by New York State and that it operates throughout all of Suffolk County, results in this factor weighing in favor of immunity.

#### • The Kind of Function or Land Use Involved

As noted above, the Project is an essential government function. Specifically, the State has given the SCWA authority to provide water to the people of Suffolk County. The Project involves connecting SCWA's Southold system to the rest of its system and the construction of associated infrastructure to improve the capacity and quality of water supplied. This involves the construction of an underground pipeline primarily within existing road rights-of-way and the construction of a booster station in the Town of Riverhead.

Water main installation will be accomplished through open-cut installation and directional drilling. Trenching will only be opened for each day's work, typically 300-400 feet each day. All impacted roads will be fully restored. In consideration of the community, SCWA will avoid road openings and traffic interruptions during the busy fall season and will ensure the road work does not hinder emergency services response. Where appropriate, SCWA will work during night hours to reduce the impacts on traffic.

In fact, SCWA has previously installed approximately 7,000 feet of water main in Riverhead and is installing approximately 20,000 feet of main in Riverhead under an agreement with the Town. The Town has never asserted regulatory or land use jurisdiction over SCWA in connection with any of these prior projects – other than requiring a ministerial road opening permit. Likewise, the Town has never before required SCWA to obtain an easement to locate any mains in a Riverhead road right-of-way.

Accordingly, because the Project is for an essential government function of providing safe and adequate drinking water, the only rational conclusion is that this factor weighs in favor of immunity for SCWA.

#### • The Extent of the Public Interest to be Served by the Function or Use

This is often the most important factor to be considered. By statute, the Project is undisputably "for the benefit of the people of the county of Suffolk and the state of New York, for the improvement of their health, welfare and prosperity" and serves a "public purpose." N.Y. Pub. Auth. L. §1077(3). Here, the Town of Riverhead claims that the Project does not serve a public interest because there is no benefit to the residents of the Town of Riverhead. However, the fact that the Project does not benefit the Town of Riverhead has no bearing on the analysis.

Here, the Project will serve a "quintessential governmental function" authorized by state statute and will promote the public health of County residents by providing safe and adequate potable water to an area where demand sometimes exceeds supply and where wells sometimes have specific parameters imposed on them because of contamination concerns or salt-water intrusion concerns. In such situations, "[w]here a project serves an overriding public purpose, courts have not

hesitated to find the project exempt from the host municipality's land use regulation." *See County of Herkimer*, 51 Misc. 3d at 536.

Specifically, SCWA operates 60 wells in Southold and uses these wells to provide water in Southold. (There is an emergency interconnection with the Riverhead Water District on the southwest part of the system). As of 2025, the combined capacity of the wells is 12,750 gallons per minute (gpm). SCWA has one elevated tank and two ground level reservoirs in the Town providing 2.8 million gallons of capacity.

Southold experiences a summer population surge as exemplified by the increase in water delivered in the Town from a winter average of 1,800 gallons per minute (gpm) to a peak range in the summer from 9,000 gpm to 12,000 gpm in the early morning. The highest pre-2024 recorded demand in Southold occurred on July 12, 2023, when SCWA provided 12,970 gpm of water to its customers by producing 9,666 gpm from its wells and releasing 3,304 gpm of water from its storage facilities in the Town. The contribution from the storage facilities highlights the shortfall between pumping capacity and system demand. At times, the water levels in SCWA tank at Moore's Lane have fallen below 3 feet from its 30-foot maximum. Without a ready supply of water in the event of emergency, such as a large fire, a well failure, or detection of a regulated substance at a level requiring discontinuing the use of a well, it would be a significant challenge to meet demand.

SCWA has explored increasing the number of wells in Southold but the aquifer system in the Town cannot support a significant increase in the number of wells or withdrawals. Southold wells have been a focal point of Department of Environmental Conservation Staff, as many of the wells operate within special parameters imposed on them due to their depth and the water table's unique configuration and the potential for salt-water intrusion. This creates a mismatch between the amount of water in the Southold system and water demand.

Upon completion of the first phase, SCWA's Southold water supply system will be integrated and operated as a unified component of the broader SCWA water supply system. This will allow SCWA to reduce reliance on its Southold wells while simultaneously increasing the amount of water available to existing Southold customers to meet the demand.

With less reliance on shallow Southold wells, SCWA will be able to cutback on the use and possibly retire wells impacted by saltwater intrusion or emerging contaminants thereby avoiding the cost of treatment systems.

Importing water from outside the Southold hydrogeologic cycle will provide additional recharge to help restore the thin aquifer.

With SCWA pumping less water from Southold, the agriculture industry may pump water for irrigation with less risk of saltwater intrusion.

The Southold community relies on water supplied by SCWA for fire protection and emergency response. In order to provide adequate pressure for fire flow, SCWA needs its water storage tanks to have adequate supply. During peak summer demand, storage tanks on the North Fork can run dangerously low, particularly the Moore's Lane tank in Greenport. This has led to customers experience low pressure in the early morning hours when the demand is at its highest. Fire fighters may not have enough water and pressure to respond to an emergency if a major fire were to breakout.

Accordingly, the public interest in clean and sufficient supply of water is of the utmost public importance and weighs heavily in favor of immunity for SCWA.

#### • The Effect Local Land Use Regulation Would Have upon the Project

The Project crosses multiple municipal and jurisdictional boundaries. As a result, the application of local zoning could allow one municipality to stop or significantly alter the Project in a manner that would be detrimental to the residents of the neighboring municipality. The Court of Appeals has discouraged "parochial regulation[s] which 'could otherwise foil the fulfillment of the greater public purpose of promoting'" an adequate supply of public water. *See County of Herkimer, supra.* 

While local governments have home rule jurisdiction over many things, their jurisdiction is not without limitations. Pursuant to Section 10 of the General Municipal Law, the rights of the Town are not meant to infringe upon SCWA's ability to conduct its essential governmental function. It would be inconsistent with *Monroe*, and detrimental to the regional nature of the Project, the Public Authorities Law if SCWA is required to submit to local municipal reviews of the Project. Such a result would then subject SCWA projects to approximately 43 different municipal jurisdictions and codes – an outcome that would be significantly detrimental to SCWA's essential governmental purposes.

Moreover, SCWA has standardized system facilities to compress review time by Suffolk County Department of Health Services and to maximize efficiency and productivity and to speed procurement of materials. If SCWA needed a different set of specifications for each site, then design lags would take place in trying to obtain the local approvals as well as procuring materials for the systems/buildings. Delays will also be experienced on the vendor and SCWA sides in the review process as the number of engineering submittals would dramatically increase. Currently, bidders are not faced with a learning curve on every project and manufacturers know what is expected. However, unknown items create risk to bidders and manufacturers and result in higher costs and

sometimes in longer time needed as submittals may have to go back and forth numerous times.

SCWA systems are maintained and operated by a limited number of employees that include generalized trades such as field operators, and specialized trades such as electricians and mechanics. Specialized trades must be capable of deploying to any site when needed and generalized trades must be familiar with as large a number of sites as practicable to allow for succession, union bidding, and absences of other field operators.

If the forty-three (43) different municipalities were allowed to regulate SCWA's operations, this would put up borders at town/village boundaries and would effectively defeat the advantages of the pressure zone approach to operating a water system employed where hydraulics and water quality govern. One of the chief benefits for SCWA's de-centralized system (with hundreds of wells and well fields) is that the zones are capable of backing up individual wells or even well fields by automatically responding to demands in the system. Adding constraints to this system would decrease system reliability and flexibility. For instance, during a main break or pump failure or water quality issue, SCWA's system can rely on other sites and treatment systems to overcome that lack of supply. Constraining SCWA's ability to deploy its vast assets limits reliability and could also result in decreased fire protection.

Accordingly, SCWA must be immune from local control in connection with the Project and every future project so as not to be constrained by forty-three different sets of regulations and approvals.

#### • The Impact upon Legitimate Local Interests

The Project will result in temporary impacts associated with construction of the water line under local municipal roads. However, SCWA has constructed and is constructing additional mains under roads in the local municipalities in connection with other projects. As a result, SCWA is fully aware of the potential local impacts and managing construction to minimize those local impacts on the municipalities and their residents. In fact, SCWA will minimize traffic impacts as follows: Trenching will only be opened for each day's work, typically 300-400 feet each day. All impacted roads will be fully restored. In consideration of the community, SCWA will avoid road openings and traffic interruptions during the busy fall season and will ensure there is no impact on emergency response services. Where appropriate, SCWA will work during night hours to reduce the impacts on traffic.

Town of Southold officials expressed concerns about the increase in water resulting in additional development in the Town. However, the Project will have no bearing on development as development within the Town of Southold will continue to be subject to Town of Southold zoning regulations.

Accordingly, while there are legitimate local interests for the municipalities, SCWA is fully aware of how to manage and minimize those impacts.

#### • The Applicant's Legislative Grant of Authority

SCWA is authorized by the New York State legislature pursuant to the Public Authorities Law to supply water to the people of Suffolk County. Accordingly, its grant of authority takes priority over local land use regulations that could impede the supply of water and weighs heavily in favor of immunity. See County of Herkimer, supra.

#### Alternative Locations for the Facility in Less Restrictive Zoning Areas

SCWA plans on, and, in fact, is required to explore alternatives in the DEIS. However, regardless of the availability of alternative routes, the water main will have to travel through the Town of Riverhead to get to the Town of Southold.

#### • Alternative Methods of Providing the Needed Improvement

SCWA plans on, and, in fact, is required to explore alternatives in the DEIS. However, regardless of the availability of alternative methods, the water main will have to travel through the Town of Riverhead to get to the Town of Southold.

SCWA cannot solve the current problem by constructing additional tanks in Southold because SCWA's Southold system does not have the extra capacity that would be required to fill them. This is demonstrated by SCWA's difficulty in maintaining adequate water levels in the Moores Lane tank.

SCWA has committed to maintaining and protecting current Southold supply infrastructure to maintain/improve water quality in our aquifers by allowing those wells to rest more often, thus mitigating chloride intrusion, but to do so requires the Project.

### • The Degree of Intergovernmental Participation in the Project Development Process/Opportunity to be Heard.

SCWA designed its review of the Project to ensure meaningful public and intergovernmental participation. To date, SCWA has held three public scoping sessions on the Project. More than 100 people, including numerous Town employees, and its consultant, have attended one or more of the hearings. The issues raised by the Town and by others will be appropriately addressed in the final scope and in more detail in the DEIS. After the DEIS is complete, SCWA will hold more public hearings.

In addition, SCWA held three public hearings on the Monroe factor analysis in the Towns of Southampton, Southold and Riverhead on October 7, 8 and 9, 2025 respectively. Officials from the local municipalities participated in the hearings as well as some local residents.

By the conclusion of the environmental review, at least nine public hearings will have occurred on the Project and the analysis of the *Monroe* factors in the DEIS.

Although the Towns are not involved agencies, they are still an interested agencies in the SEQRA process. An interested agency is provided with information and given the opportunity to provide comments and express concerns. SCWA will analyze the concerns raised by the Towns identified during the scoping sessions. This process is consistent with the direction provided by the NYSDEC in its lead agency determination letter and weighs in favor of immunity for SCWA.

**ACCORDINGLY BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that SCWA is immune from zoning and land use regulations, including, but not limited to the Towns of Southampton, Riverhead and Southold in connection with the Project.

General Session: Legislative Updates for Land Surveyors in New York and Beyond

This session will review legislation passed in 2019, which became effective April of 2021 that now includes an educational component for Licensed Surveyors in New York. The law eliminated the all-experience pathway and replaced it with various pathways requiring either a bachelor's degree or higher in land surveying; an accredited associate's degree in land surveying, or an associate's degree or higher in engineering, math, or related science with acceptable credits in land surveying that have been approved by the New York State Department of Education. The session will also include a presentation regarding efforts being made at the national level to promote the profession of surveying through workforce development. The presentation will have a brief government affairs update to share any recent changes to legislation affecting land surveyors and review the status of the transition to the new datums in the modernized National Spatial Reference System (NSRS) affecting surveyors. The goal is to benefit both the attendees as well as their colleagues and coworkers once they return to the workplace and share what they have learned.

#### Ethics for the Geomatic Professional NY LS/PE: 2.0; NH .50; VT 2.0; NJ 2.0 Scott R. Reeser, PLS 10:00am – 12:00pm

Attendees will review published definitions of Professional Ethics, as well as cultivate a group definition. The Canons of Ethics, published by the New York State Association of Professional Land Surveyors, will be reviewed, as well as ethical codes from other surveying and engineering professional organizations. The use of GNSS technology has become common within the surveying profession. This is especially true when it comes to the use of real-time techniques (Real-Time Kinematic) and Real-Time Networks (RTN). These techniques offer methods that significantly increase productivity, with little degradation of accuracy. But a tool by itself does not produce accuracy or confidence. The procedures used, and attention to detail by the user is what helps to ensure you achieve the results you are aiming for. In this workshop, we will discuss the GNSS tools and techniques that are available, their adequacy for common survey tasks, and take an in-depth look at "best practices" that have been developed by practitioners (including two of your own) that are designed to catch blunders, eliminate common systematic errors, and increase confidence in surveying results. We will also look at the newly released NGS Standards and Specifications, which include the use of Real-Time techniques, and provide research showing why certain specifications or techniques are required.

Agricultural stonewalls, the grandest of all boundary line monumentation, had a distinct roll in forming New York's early landscape as well as its boundary line case law. This presentation will acquaint the attendee with the history of stone walls. The human interaction with these stones will be explored, looking at the wall placement, their juxtaposition and functions. Tracking their evolution from being an agricultural structure to a boundary line landform. Tying these unique monuments to a boundary line location is not an automatic exercise. We will review the Doctrine of Practical Location and the legal concept of Acquiescence. For the doctrine to apply, there must be "a clear demarcation and equally known, understood and settled". (McMahon v Thornton, 69 AD3d 1157, 1160 [2010]. We will explore case laws that rely on these overruling principles to move the boundary as described in the deeds to the physical location of a stone wall.



Original land survey records of circa 17th-19th centuries are an indispensable source for geographers, ecologists, and other researchers who study past forested landscapes. This course covers the uses of these records — particularly surveyor "field notes" — for historical forest reconstruction. Researchers have used these records to map past forest communities, understand the geographical ranges of now-threatened tree species, comprehend the extent of Native American land management upon forests, and reveal relationships between tree species or communities with soil and climate conditions. This course will also provide advice on locating surveyor field notes from collections, and how to map such records using historical and modern data sources within GIS software.

The class will examine how breakline data can be created from point data and included in a Surface, using not only Civil 3D® tools but from other solutions, including Carlson® and SmartDraft®. The course will also include the assessment of survey accuracy and surface presentation via styles.

This course is intended for prospective land surveyor licensure applicants and land surveyor professionals interested in best nurturing future professionals on their team.
