We recommend that potential impacts of the proposed project on these species or communities be addressed as part of any environmental assessment or review conducted as part of the planning, permitting and approval process, such as reviews conducted under SEQR. Field surveys of the project site may be necessary to determine the status of a species at the site, particularly for sites that are currently undeveloped and may still contain suitable habitat. Final requirements of the project to avoid, minimize, or mitigate potential impacts are determined by the lead permitting agency or the government body approving the project.

The following natural communities are considered significant from a statewide perspective by the NY Natural Heritage Program. Each community is either an example of a community type that is rare in the state, or a high-quality example of a more common community type. By meeting specific, documented criteria, the NY Natural Heritage Program considers these community occurrences to have high ecological and conservation value.

The plants are in dense, mostly graminoid vegetation dominated by <i>Spartina patens</i> , <i>Spartina alterniflora</i> , <i>Distichlis</i> , <i>Juncus gerardii</i> , <i>Salicornia</i> spp., and <i>Phragmites</i> .				
Coastal Fireweed	<i>Erechtites hieraciifolius</i> <i>var. megalocarpus</i>	Endangered	Critically Imperiled in NYS	2160
Documented within 0.2 mile of project site. East Marion, 1990-09-18: This is 100 acres of a variety of habitats, including glacial boulders and pebbles, salt pond with marsh zone, interior marsh grading to shrubs, cedar zone, and mixed oak woodland. There are open fields towards the south and true freshwater wetlands to the west. The plants are in mostly coarse gravel.

Documented at the project site. East Marion, 2006-09-01: The plants are located along the edge of a small salt pond with some marsh development. The entire site includes about 100 acres of a variety of habitats, including glacial boulders and pebbles, salt pond with marsh zone, interior marsh grading to shrubs, cedar zone, and mixed oak woodland. Open fields are towards the south. True freshwater wetlands are to the west.

Documented within 0.4 mile southeast of project site. This is a very poor quality site for the <i>Polygonum glaucum</i> .

Documented within 0.4 mile north of the west end of the project site. East Marion, 1990-09-18: Relatively narrow pebbly beach that is about 75 feet from the edge of the water to the established shrub zone. Most beach vegetation along a well-developed high wrack line.				



The following rare plant has historical records in the vicinity of the following project: Suffolk County Water Authority -- East Marion to Orient Extension (Phase 2).

The following rare plant was documented in the vicinity of the project site at one time, but have not been documented there since 1985 or earlier, and/or there is uncertainty regarding their continued presence. There is no recent information on these plants and animals in the vicinity of the project site and their current status there is unknown. In most cases the precise location of the plant or animal in this vicinity at the time it was last documented is also unknown.

If suitable habitat for this plant is present in the vicinity of the project site, it is possible that they may still occur there. We recommend that any field surveys to the site include a search for this species, particularly at sites that are currently undeveloped and may still contain suitable habitat.

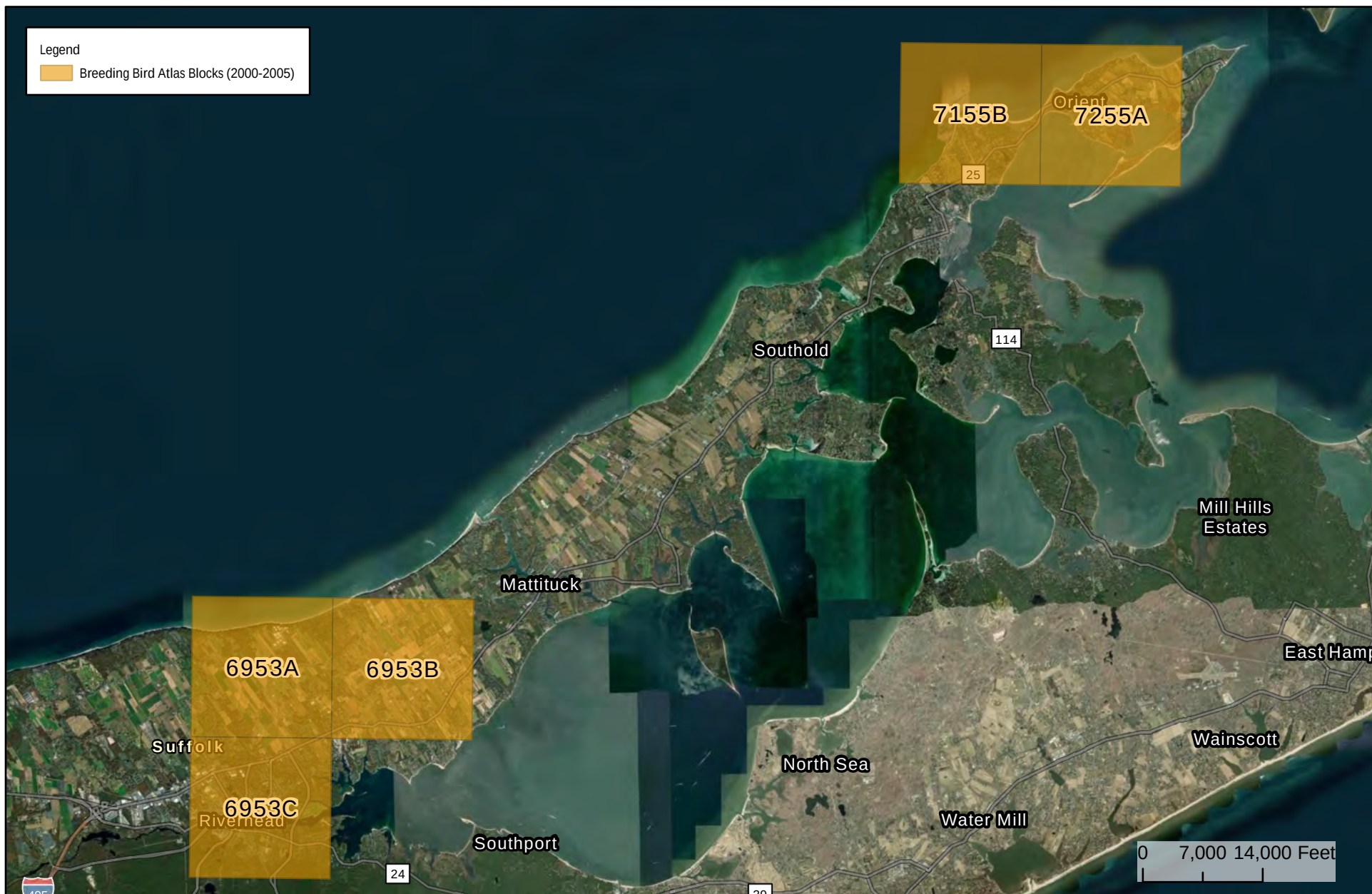
