## ATTENTION: OPTIONS FOR PRIVATE SERVICE LINE INSTALLATION FOR ELIGIBLE WAINSCOTT WATER DISTRICT RESIDENTS

Eligible residents residing within the Wainscott Water District have two (2) options for the installation of their *private service line*. In both options, the resident pays for the private service line; however how they differ are as follows:

**Option A:** Under this option, as per our letter sent to you on July 31, 2018, SCWA's contractor, Asplundh Construction, will install a private service line between your residence/business and the SCWA system. There are standardized unit prices used to estimate the cost of the installation depending on the service diameter, length of service line, inside tie-in, expansion tank, and RPZ (if required). However, the actual cost after Asplundh Construction performs the work is subject to change based on the scope of the installation. It's important to note that if you choose this option you will pay no upfront costs and the cost of the service line installation will be amortized over a 20 year term to include an interest charge and be incorporated in your real estate tax bill by the Town of East Hampton. The amortized cost will be collected as part of your real estate taxes over a 20 year period.

**Option B:** The second option available to you is to hire your own licensed plumber to install the service line. Under this option, you have the ability to solicit prices from plumbers for installation of your private service line. This option could potentially result in a *lower* private service line installation cost for you. However, you will be responsible for paying for the installation in full at the time of installation and you will not be eligible for the 20 year term offered by the Town of East Hampton.

The two options provide you with choices based on your personal circumstances. In the event you wish to compare the costs between a private plumber and SCWA's contractor, the Authority has performed a cost estimate for each residence/business, and it is available upon request by calling Marie Berkoski at 631-563-0251 or Fred Berg at 631-563-0239.

To indicate your choice, please enter your address, sign and return the attached acknowledgement along with the application card sent to you on July 30<sup>th</sup>.
