- a. ITRON Sales Agreement
Enter into a Sales Agreement with ITRON for upgraded meter reading system software (F.C.S. – Field Collection System) at an installation fee of \$9,940.

b. Purchase of Compressed Natural Gas (CNG)

Authorize the establishment of a blanket/open order for the purchase of CNG fuel from Clean Energy in the amount of \$50,000.

c) Work/Life Assistance Program

Authorize entering into an agreement with Corporate Counseling Associates Inc. (CCA) of New York, New York, for the work/life assistance program, during the three-year period beginning April 1, 2017, at a rate of \$2 per employee per month, for an approximate annual cost of \$14,000.

d) RFP 1504 – Defense Counsel

Accept proposal of McCabe Collins McGeough Fowler Levine & Nogan, LLP, Sobel and Pevzner, LLC, LaSalle, LaSalle & Dwyer, PC and O'Connor, O'Connor, Hintz & Deveney, LLP for defense counsel during the one-year period beginning on or about March 1, 2017.

5. General

a) Budgets – Fiscal Year Ending May 31, 2018

Authorize the approval of Operating & Maintenance and Construction Budgets for Fiscal Year ending May 31, 2018.

b) Water Wise Club – Eligible Item Credits

Authorize the inclusion of irrigation timers to the East End Water Wise Club eligible items for account rebates.

6. Property Casualty Insurance

a) Property

Renew policy with Starr Indemnity - Ace American Insurance Company.
i. Renew broker service agreement with Willis Towers Watson, Willis of New York, Inc.

b) General Liability, Auto and Lead Umbrella (\$10,000,000)

Purchase a new policy from Allied World Assurance Company.

c) Excess/Umbrella Liability

1st Layer \$25 million limit: Renew with Travelers
2nd Layer \$15 million limit: Renew with Great American Insurance Company.

d) Purchase new one OCP policy with Allied World Assurance Company in the name of the Town of Brookhaven.

e) Renew broker service agreement with Wells Fargo for above coverages b), c) and d).

- f) Directors & Officers Liability
Renew with Willis Towers Watson, Willis of New York, Inc. acting as broker on a commission basis.
- g) Comprehensive Crime
Renew with Travelers with Willis Towers Watson, Willis of New York, Inc. acting as broker on a commission basis.
- h) Surety – Street Opening Permit Bonds
Renew with Hartford In. Co. with Willis Towers Watson, Willis of New York, Inc. acting as broker on a commission basis.
- i) Authorize the Risk Management Department, in consultation with the CEO and General Counsel, to settle claims that occur between April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018, and fall within the self-insured policy retention or deductible limits.
- j) Authorize the Risk Management Department, in conjunction with the CEO and General Counsel, to increase/decrease coverages or purchase additional insurance as required by the operations of the Authority.

7. Workers' Compensation Insurance

- a) Renew the Authority's Broker/Consultant agreement for a one year period beginning April 1, 2017, with Bay Oaks Group, located at 584 Ardsley Boulevard, Suite 204, Garden City, NY, at a fee of \$57,729; and to approve an estimated amount of \$5,000 for 3rd party workers compensation claims audits performed by an outside vendor obtained by Bay Oaks Group.

Purchase excess workers compensation and employers liability policy from the Safety National Insurance Company providing coverage for any claim that exceeds \$750,000 at a premium of \$157,388 subject to payroll audit;

Enter into an agreement with Arthur J. Gallagher & Company, located at One Jericho Plaza, Suite 200, Jericho, NY, for insurance broker services relating to the purchase and servicing the excess insurance policy during the one-year period beginning April 1, 2017, at a cost of \$12,500.

Authorize the CEO in conjunction with General Counsel and the Risk Management Department to implement an Authority Safety and Risk Management Assessment with PMA Management Corp. at an amount not to exceed \$15,000.

8. Equipment

a) TurboVap II Concentration Workstations for Laboratory

Authorize the purchase of two TurboVap II Concentration Workstations from the sole source manufacturer and distributor, Biotage of Charlotte, North Carolina, for the Authority's Laboratory, in the amount of \$18,810.

b) Floor Cleaner Purchase

Authorize the purchase of a Windsor Chariot iScrub Mini floor cleaner from Ocean Janitorial of Islip, New York, for the Authority's Production Control Department, in the amount of \$6,727.

c) Instrument Service for Laboratory

Authorize ThermoFisher Scientific (formerly Dionex) of West Palm Beach, Florida, to provide annual on-call service to repair the four IC instruments as needed during the one-year period beginning April 1, 2017, for an amount not to exceed \$40,000.

d) Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) for PFOS and PFOA Removal

Authorize the purchase of 3 loads of a specific GAC for PFOS and PFOA removal for use at the Authority's wells around Gabreski Airport, at a cost of \$150,000.

a) Grade IIB Operators Course

Authorize Victor Elefante Technical Services (VETS) of Wantagh, New York, to provide the Grade IIB Operators Course at the Authority's Bay Shore office, two evening per week for 7-8 weeks, for 9 Authority employees at a cost of \$550 per person at a maximum cost of \$4,950.

b) 2014 National Electrical Code Changes Seminar

Authorize the attendance of 4 employees of the Electrical Engineering Department and 3 employees of the Production Control's Electrical Section, at a seminar which covers the 2014 National Electrical Code changes at Electrical Training Center's facility in Copiague, New York, (dates to be determined) at a total cost of \$1,500.

c) LabWare Customer Education Conference 2017

Authorize the attendance of Linda Santisi, Application Developer, at the LabWare Customer Education Conference in Orlando, Florida, from May 7 through May 12, 2017, at an approximate cost of \$1,850.

d) Engage 311 Conference

Authorize the attendance of two (2) staff members, subject to CEO's approval, at the 2017 Engage 311 Conference in Fort Worth, Texas, from May 22 to May 24, 2017, at an approximate cost of \$2,000 per person.

e) 2017 Customer Service Week Conference
